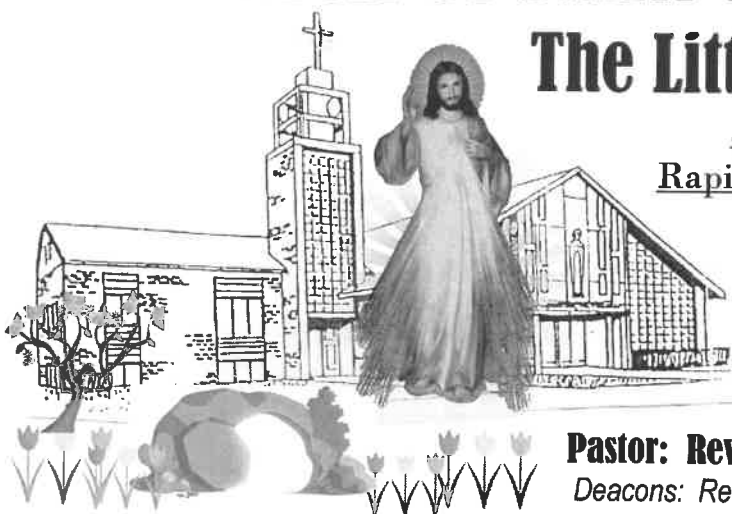

Fr. Kerry's Korner

There was no needy person among them, for those who owned property or houses would sell them, bring the proceeds of the sale, and put them at the feet of the apostles, and they were distributed to each according to need.
Acts 4.35

Brothers and sisters,

The mercy of God is described in many ways: it is his committed love for us in a covenant that will never be revoked, a tender love that cares for us as if we were the only one to love. It is not intangible, but rather, finds expression in real spiritual and physical needs. God's mercy is sustaining. It arises from a promise he made to us that he would be with us always unto the end of the world.

St. Faustina said in Diary, "I demand from you deeds of mercy, which are to arise out of love for Me. You are to show mercy to your neighbors always and everywhere. You must not shrink from this or try to excuse or absolve yourself from it. I am giving you three ways of exercising mercy toward your neighbor: the first - by deed, the second - by word, the third - by prayer. In these three degrees is contained the fullness of mercy, and it is an unquestionable proof of love for Me. By this means a soul glorifies and pays reverence to My mercy." (742)

Divine Mercy Sunday reveals the importance of the spiritual and corporal works of mercy that we are taught in catechism. The Catechism of the Catholic Church lists them succinctly: "The works of mercy are charitable actions for the aid of our neighbor in his or her spiritual and bodily necessities. Instructing, advising, consoling, comforting are spiritual works of mercy, as are forgiving and bearing wrongs patiently. The corporal works of mercy consist especially in feeding the hungry, sheltering the homeless, clothing the naked, visiting the sick and imprisoned, and burying the dead. Among all these, giving alms to the poor is one of the chief witnesses to fraternal charity; it is also a work of justice pleasing to God." (CCC. 2447).

They are not works arising from pity. They, rather, imitate the love of God through justice. Mercy is a powerful means to provide justice and bring forth peace.

Year of St. Joseph Indulgences

Granted by the Holy See from December 8, 2020 to December 8, 2021

Below is a summary of how you can receive the special indulgences granted by the Holy See for the Year of St. Joseph

A Plenary indulgence is granted under the customary conditions (sacramental confession, Eucharistic communion and prayer according to the intentions of the Holy Father) to the faithful who, with a soul detached from any sin, shall participate in the Year of Saint Joseph in any of the following ways:

- ✚ Meditate for 30 minutes on the Our Father
- ✚ Participate on a 1-day retreat with a meditation on St. Joseph
- ✚ Perform corporal and/or spiritual works of mercy
- ✚ Recite the Holy Rosary as a couple or with family members
- ✚ Pray the Litany of St. Joseph
- ✚ Recite any approved prayer in honor of St. Joseph, especially on the days dedicated to St. Joseph: March 19, May 1, the 19th of every month, and on any Wednesday.
- ✚ Entrust their work daily to the protection of St. Joseph
- ✚ Invoke, with their prayers, the intercession of St. Joseph

The gift of the plenary indulgence extends particularly to:

- ✚ The elderly
- ✚ The sick
- ✚ The dying
- ✚ All those who for legitimate reasons cannot leave their home-who, with the spirit detached from any sin and with the intention of fulfilling, as soon as possible, the 3 usual conditions, **pray an act of piety in honor St. Joseph, confidently offering God the pains & difficulties of their lives.**

Definition of Indulgences: A plenary indulgence means that by the merits of Jesus Christ, The Blessed Virgin Mary, and all the saints, the full remission of the temporal punishment due to sacramentally forgiven sins is obtained. The person becomes as if just baptized and would fly immediately to heaven if he died in that instant. A partial indulgence means that a portion of the temporal punishment due to forgiven sin is remitted. Indulgences can be applied to oneself or to a deceased loved one, but not to another living person.
