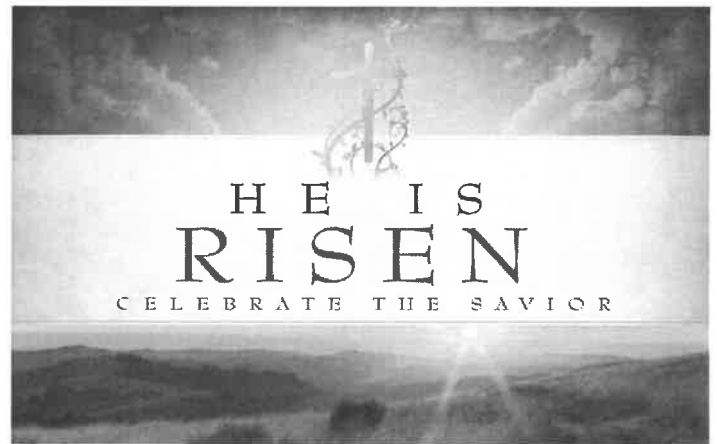

== Fr. Kerry's Korner ==

**Jesus is Risen! He is Truly Risen!
Happy Easter everyone.**

This most unusual of Holy Weeks culminates in the age-old reality of the resurrection. I pray that your Easter will be a profound renewal of St. Paul's good word, "it is no longer I who lives, but Christ lives in me." The truth of our faith, despite the harsh reality of our social isolation, is we have been made one in the Spirit which is given to us. One in faith, one in Baptism, one in the Trinity.

We who are born again in Baptism have been made new. Jesus, in his human body, was raised from the dead. We who have died with Christ in Baptism, are living a life more our own than before. The gospels make it clear that Jesus was not a ghost, but they also make it clear that he was not simply a resuscitated body. Jesus' body was physical, not spiritual and ghostly and ephemeral. However, it was also not like our bodies. It didn't relate to the physical world like ours. Jesus' resurrection body was not less real than this physical world, but more real.

In a favorite C.S. Lewis book, *The Great Divorce*, the souls from purgatory make a visit to heaven and they find that world to be more real than they are. The blades of grass hurt their feet. The apples are too heavy to pick up. They are afraid of the rain for it will pierce them like bullets. The light was too bright, accustomed as they were to gloom. In Christ we become who we were meant to be, fully human, and fully alive. The church teaches that at the end of time our bodies will be reconstituted into our resurrection body.

This Easter day I encourage you to look upon Christ who died and is risen. Make your spiritual communion asking Christ to be one with you. Remember these words of St. Augustine, "Recognize in this Bread what hung upon the Cross, and this chalice what flowed from his side."

Palm Sunday: Jesus is risen from the dead. We are invited to believe in the resurrection and live our lives reflecting the resurrection, proclaiming the good news. In the Eucharist, we can do this week by week and receive strength from this real encounter with the risen Lord to become his disciples.

Good Friday: Jesus gives his life for us, freely and without and coercion. He died and rose that we might confidently follow in his footsteps, sacrificing ourselves for his sake. In the Eucharist we enter deeply and profoundly into the passion of Jesus, into his sacrifice and with him, we find victory, victory in our willingness to suffer with him and be raised to new life.

Easter Vigil: Jesus is risen. He fulfills the whole of the Old Testament and calls God's people to not be afraid but rather to believe and proclaim the resurrection. In the Eucharist, we fulfill this command first, by recalling Jesus' death and resurrection, by joining our lives to his and then by being sent out to proclaim the goodness of God and invite others to the table of the resurrected Lord.

Easter Sunday: Jesus is risen from the dead. We are invited to believe in the resurrection and live our lives reflecting the resurrection, proclaiming the good news. In the Eucharist, we can do this week by week and receive strength from this real encounter with the risen Lord to become his disciples.

JESUS, I TRUST IN YOU!

Why Did Jesus Fold the Napkin? Why did Jesus fold the linen burial cloth after His resurrection? I never noticed this. The Gospel of John (20:7) tells us that the napkin, which was placed over the face of Jesus, was not just thrown aside like the grave clothes. The Bible takes an entire verse to tell us that the napkin was neatly folded, and was placed at the head of that stony coffin. *Early Sunday morning, while it was still dark, Mary Magdalene came to the tomb and found that the stone had been rolled away from the entrance. She ran and found Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one whom Jesus loved. She said, "They have taken the Lord's body out of the tomb, and I don't know where they have put him!" Peter and the other disciple ran to the tomb to see. The other disciple out ran Peter and got there first. He stopped and looked in and saw the linen cloth lying there, but he didn't go in. Then Simon Peter arrived and went inside. He also noticed the linen wrappings lying there, while the cloth that had covered Jesus' head was folded up and lying to the side. Was that important? Absolutely! Is it really significant? Yes! We need to understand a little bit about Hebrew tradition of that day: the folded napkin had to do with the Master and Servant, and every Jewish boy knew this tradition. When the servant set the dinner table for the master, he made sure that it was exactly the way the master wanted it. The table was furnished perfectly, and then the servant would wait, just out of sight, until the master had finished eating, and the servant would not dare touch that table, until the master was finished. Now if the master were done eating, he would rise from the table, wipe his fingers, his mouth, and clean his beard, and would wad up that napkin and toss it onto the table. The servant would then know to clear the table. For in those days, the wadded napkin meant, "I'm finished." But if the master got up from the table, and folded his napkin, and laid it beside his plate, the servant would not dare touch the table, because the folded napkin meant, "I'M COMING BACK!"*
