Faithful Citizenship "As defined by the United Nations, human trafficking is a modern-day form of slavery that consists of the illegal trade of human beings through force, fraud, or coercion for the purposes of commercial sexual exploitation or forced labor. It takes a variety of forms in every region of the world. Some people are trafficked for prostitution, pornography, and other forms of sexual exploitation. Some are trafficked for forced labor in agriculture, sweat shops, and domestic servitude. Some are trafficked for both. Through sexual slavery, the body becomes little more than an object to be exploited. For victims of forced labor, the body is made into a disposable machine, made to work long hours for little or no pay and for the profit of others. In both cases the person who is enslaved is treated as an object for another's benefit. Monday the 15th of August is the Feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary into heaven. The stories about Mary's Assumption into heaven were not written down until the fourth century. The events that were passed down through the years say that Mary lived a fairly long life and just fell asleep and didn't wake up. This happened in a home in or very near Jerusalem. She was buried and later, for some reason, it was decided to open her grave. When they did this they discovered that there was not a body at all in the casket. The assumption was made by the apostles that God (Jesus) had taken her both body and soul into heaven. Mary was conceived without original sin and committed no sins during her life. Death and corruption of the body is the result of sin; it makes sense that God would spare her from a punishment she did not deserve. Not to mention that she was always close to her Divine Son and God the Father. Mary's Assumption is a sign of encouragement and joy for us who hope to live both body and soul one day in the presence of God. The angel Gabriel said; "Hail full of grace. The Lord is with you." 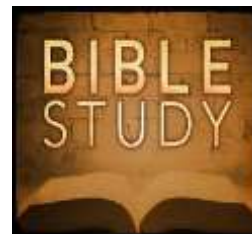

An Update from the Hope For New Life (HFNL) Jail Ministry 2,220,300

This number represents the total of adults incarcerated in federal/state prisons and county jails in the United States in 2013, the latest year for which complete figures are available. Sadly, the US has the highest prison population in the world at 22 percent of the total (US Bureau of Justice Statistics) and these inmates disproportionately come from the most disadvantaged sectors of our society. Perhaps even more troubling are the 54,148 juveniles serving in juvenile detention in 2013. The 400-600 inmates in the Pennington County Jail represent but a fraction of this overall total; but like all those in prison, each man and woman is a troubled and isolated child of God. These are the individuals our ministry reaches out to every Wednesday evening. Most of the men and women we visit each week are in their 20's or 30's and are incarcerated awaiting trial for substance abuse violations. The reason for their incarceration is not our concern. We bring them Our Lord's message of love and forgiveness and, as our name implies, "hope for new life." HFNL has been a continual weekly presence in the jail since July 2006. We are always received by the inmates with gratitude, respect, and a deep spiritual hunger. In this Year of Mercy, if you are seeking a way to express your spiritual mission, perhaps you may wish to explore your possibilities for service with our ministry.
