An Update from the Hope For New Life (HFNL) Jail Ministry Celebrating Nine Years of Jail Ministry Visits

In July the Hope for New Life Ministry marked its ninth year of carrying the Gospel to the inmates of Pennington County Jail. Our mission is simple: **"A Catholic ministry dedicated to serving God by offering hope, support, and encouragement to the inmates...[and] to bring God's love to them by spreading the Word of God through prayer, education and sharing."**

As Tony Galles, one of our founding members, recently put it, "We hope to sky rocket souls to heaven!" During the nine years of our visits, we have expanded from one to three groups per week; added groups for the women inmates as well as the men; conducted eight Christmas programs which include caroling and gifts of candy and cookies; distributed countless Bibles, Holy cards and prayer books; and passed along to our prayer partners and parishes thousands of inmate prayer requests. But we need more volunteers to support our mission. **"While the 'harvest' of inmates is great, the laborers in the ministry are few (12 active at present). We encourage you to spend a few months with us as a visitor...providing a helpful way to discern whether this special calling is for you."** Becoming a prayer partner is another meaningful, anonymous way to join this ministry.
