### Faithful Citizenship "I come to gather nations of every language; they shall come and see my glory."

Before nations were, God was. And God has used the plight of those fleeing from oppression to teach us of his love for all men, especially the alien. "The Israelites' experience of living as homeless aliens was so painful and frightening that God ordered his people for all time to have special care for the alien: "You shall treat the alien who resides with you no differently than the natives born among you; have the same love for him as for yourself; for you too were once aliens in the land of Egypt" (Lv 19:33-34). The right of people to migrate to sustain their lives and the lives of their families is the first of three basic principles of Catholic Social teaching on Immigration. The second principle, however, is that a country has the right to regulate its borders and to control immigration. The way in which these two potentially conflicting statements are reconciled is with the third principle, that a country must regulate its borders with justice and mercy. Before engaging in a potentially cantankerous discussion of immigration policy, consider reviewing the USCCB's thoughtful article on this important topic.

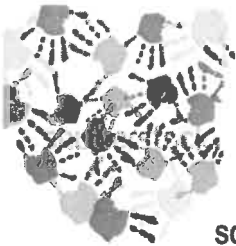
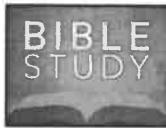

## But Should We? The Ethics of Artificial Reproductive Technologies

Just because we can, doesn't mean we should.
