Each prayer partner receives an email each week listing the prayers of the men and women we visit each Wednesday evening at the Pennington County Jail. Your email address is never released to the jail or to anyone outside of this prayer group. Your response is up to you: a personal prayer for each inmate, a rosary for their intentions, or time spent in Adoration on their behalf. Whatever your response, the power of prayer is truly the power that makes our ministry work.
