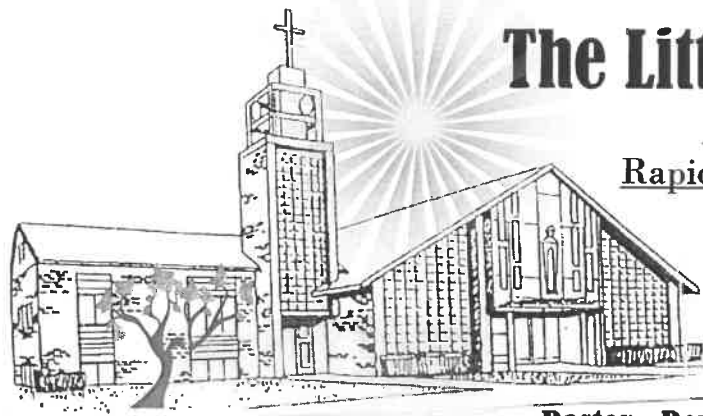

This week's Korner is written by Anthony Flores

RCIA Invitation

The famous writer of *The Lord of the Rings*, J.R.R. Tolkien once wrote, "This story begins and ends in joy." He wasn't writing about Hobbits or Elves or Wizards, but of Christ. It's a story that continues to be expressed in our own lives and in the lives of others. This joy of dying to Christ so we may live in Him is the journey of what happens during the *Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults*, also known as RCIA, in Catholic Churches around the world.

What is RCIA? It is a time to evangelize the non-Christian whose heart has been opened by the Holy Spirit. An opportunity for the practicing Christian to be instructed in the Catholic tradition. It is also for those that were only baptized Catholic, and now desire to grow in faith and allow their baptism to be rooted deeply in their lives. Finally, for those reading this and saying, "Hey, none of that's me!" it is your chance to begin inviting those in your life to come see the beauty of what our Catholic faith has to offer. In fact, you are called and have been given the gift to do so. We all have been. St. Paul writes in Ephesians 4, "And he gave some as apostles, others as prophets, others as evangelists, others as pastors and teachers, to equip the holy ones for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ..."

Remember, it is nothing more than an invitation. One suggestion may lead someone to their story that begins and ends in joy. I am here because I was invited. And just to show you that with God the impossible is possible, I happened to be president of a Lutheran Church at the time. I became a Christian late in life, and as time passed, I was exposed to the Catholic faith in bits and pieces. Fulton Sheen said, "There are not one hundred people in the United States who hate The Catholic Church, but there are millions who hate what they wrongly perceive the Catholic Church to be." That is my story in a nutshell.

By the time I accepted the invitation and started going to RCIA here at St. Therese, many of my misconceptions had been answered, but I was still given the opportunity to ask about other teachings in the Church that at first didn't sit well with me. However, I listened. A skill I have picked up late in life, but it allowed me to see how God reveals the truth through the one, holy, Catholic, and apostolic Church. I started asking in prayer for the Holy Spirit to show me why my opinions were wrong. I was reminded of the words of St. Aquinas that "sin darkens the intellect." And wouldn't you know it, the truth was revealed. Instead of finding *my* truth, I found *the* truth. And RCIA was a major source of my own journey of joy.

So invite. Come. The RCIA team is excited to share the Catholic faith. We will begin with two meet and greet times:

6:00 – 7:30 pm on Monday, August 30th

6:00 – 7:30 pm on Monday, September 6th

And remind those that you do invite that we want to answer all their questions. The Catholic Church does not hide any of its teachings. It doesn't want to since all of it has been divinely revealed. Again, it is about an invitation to see what the Church has to offer. No topic is taboo.

We look forward to meeting those that want to join us on this Happy Highway into full communion with the Church. If anybody has any questions before we first meet, do not hesitate to call me, Anthony Flores, at 605-484-3190. I leave you with a prayer from St. Therese:

"Jesus, help me to simplify my life by learning what you want me to be and becoming that person."

While collections have not yet rebounded to 2019 levels, the parish completed the fiscal year at June 30, 2021 with about 98% of budgeted income.
