An Update from the Hope For New Life (HFNL) Jail Ministry Annual Christmas Jail Program 2015 Imagine a Christmas holiday during which you were separated from your family and friends due to your incarceration. This is a condition which fortunately few of us have experienced. But for some the pain of this separation is all too real. This was brought home to me while I was parked outside the Pennington County Jail a few weeks ago. There I noticed a young woman with two small boys looking up toward the jail windows. Suddenly, she became quite excited and began to wave joyously. Calling the little boys to her side, she pointed upward. The boys began to laugh and wave and the littlest one began to throw kisses. A family visit was in progress. Each year our ministry sponsors a Christmas caroling event in the iail. Our 9th annual program is scheduled for Sunday evening. December 20th at 7:00 pm. We are very much in need of one more guitar player to accompany our singers. The program lasts about an hour and a half. We typically give a short message about Christmas and sing 3-4 songs in each area. We also distribute candy bags for all inmates. This is often an especially moving experience for those volunteers who encounter the inside of the jail for the first time. As part of the volunteer process, you will be required to fill out two short forms a few weeks before the event so the jail has time to complete a basic background check for your clearance. The Origin of the Twelve Days of Christmas

You're all familiar with the Christmas song, "The Twelve Days of Christmas" I think. To most, it's a delightful nonsense rhyme set to music. But it had a quite serious purpose when it was written. It is a good deal more than just a repetitious melody with pretty phrases and a list of strange gifts. Catholics in England during the period 1558 to 1829, when Parliament finally emancipated Catholics in England, were prohibited from ANY practice of their faith by law - private OR public. It was a crime to BE a Catholic. "The Twelve Days of Christmas" was written in England as one of the "catechism songs" to help young Catholics learn the tenets of their faith – a memory aid, when to be caught with anything in "writing" indicating adherence to the Catholic faith could not only get you imprisoned, it could get you hanged, or shortened by a head – or hanged, drawn and guartered, a rather peculiar and ghastly punishment I'm not aware was ever practiced anywhere else. Hanging, drawing and quartering involved hanging a person by the neck until they had almost, but not quite, suffocated to death; then the party was taken down from the gallows, and disemboweled while still alive; and while the entrails were still laying on the street, where the executions stomped all over them, the victim was tied to four large farm horses, and literally torn into five parts – one to each limb and the remaining torso. The song's gifts are hidden meanings to the teachings of the faith. The "true love" mentioned in the song doesn't refer to an earthly suitor, it refers to God Himself. The "me" who receives the presents refers to every baptized person. The partridge in a pear tree is Jesus Christ, the Son of God. In the song, Christ is symbolically presented as a mother partridge which feigns injury to decoy predators from her helpless nestlings, much in memory of the expression of Christ's sadness over the fate of Jerusalem: "Jerusalem! Jerusalem! How often would I have sheltered thee under my wings, as a hen does her chicks, but thou wouldst not have it so..." The other symbols mean the following: 2 Turtle Doves= The Old and New Testaments; 3 French Hens = Faith, Hope and Charity, the Evangelists: 5 Golden Rings = The first Five Books of the Old
