
# **Church of Saint Therese**

# = Fr. Kerry's Korner =

Dear Friends,

In 1854, Pope Pius IX declared a Jubilee Marian Year, and defined a dogma infallibly, that Mary was conceived in the womb of her Mother with a particular grace, freedom from original sin and its effects. In so doing, he was stating the belief of all the successors of the apostles, the bishops around the world and the lay faithful, who held this faith as a gift from God. We celebrate the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception on December 8.

Eight years before this dogma was infallibly defined the Bishops of the United states voted to declare that our country would be placed under the protection and patronage of Mary, the Immaculate Conception. Because this is our national feast and a holiday in the Roman calendar, our bishops ask us to celebrate it with joy even though it falls on a Sunday this year. Sundays of Advent take precedent over other feasts, so the Solemnity is transferred to the 9<sup>th</sup> this year. We will have Mass at 7 a.m. and 7 p.m. at St. Therese the Little Flower, and Mass at 5 p.m. at St. John the Evangelist.

I would like to leave you with this plea from Pope Pius IX, in the encyclical Ineffabilis Deus, in which he gave us the doctrine:

Let all the children of the Catholic Church, who are so very dear to us, hear these words of ours. With a still more ardent zeal for piety, religion and love, let them continue to venerate, invoke and pray to the most Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of God, conceived without original sin. Let them fly with utter confidence to this most sweet Mother of mercy and grace in all dangers, difficulties, needs. doubts and fears. Under her guidance, under her patronage, under her kindness and protection, nothing is to be feared: nothing is hopeless. Because, while bearing toward us a truly motherly affection and having in her care the work of our salvation, she is solicitous about the whole human race. And since she has been appointed by God to be the Queen of heaven and earth, and is exalted above all the choirs of angels and saints, and even stands at the right hand of her only-begotten Son, Jesus Christ our Lord, she presents our petitions in a most efficacious manner. What she asks, she obtains. Her pleas can never be unheard.


## **Hope For New Life (HFNL) Ministry**
