Faithful Citizenship "Edith Stein was born a Jew in what is now Wroclaw, Poland, in 1891. She spent much of her adult life without practicing any religion, but rather based her beliefs on science and philosophy. However, after reading the writings of St. Teresa of Avila, she was quickly converted to Roman Catholicism. When she was 43 years old, she entered a Carmelite monastery, and became Sister Teresa Benedicta of the Cross. During World War II, the Nazis declared that all Jews, even those who had converted to Catholicism would be put into concentration camps. Since Edith would not renounce her Jewish background, she was sent to Auschwitz with other Jews. Because of her solidarity with the oppressed Jewish people, she too was killed in the gas chambers at Auschwitz. ... She was canonized by Pope John Paul II in 1998 and is known as St. Teresa Benedict of the Cross. 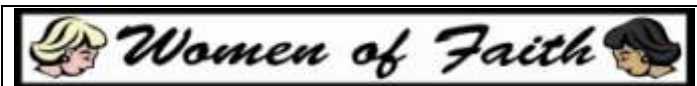

The Rapid City Catholic School System is in the midst of its 6th annual Packing Hope campaign.
