**Faithful Citizenship** "Hope for New Life Jail Ministry has expanded to serve three men's and three women's groups and are looking for volunteers. The organization is a Catholic ministry inspired by Jesus' call in the beatitudes to participate in the corporal works of mercy. According to volunteer Jennifer Shama, the group consists of people of many faiths but a majority have background in the Catholic faith. ... One evening per week, members of the group visit inmates at Pennington Country Jail and give a short presentation on a topic. They serve an average of 30-40 people per week. At the end of each session, inmates have the opportunity to ask for prayer requests. ... 'We are looking for anyone who wants to volunteer at the jail or for the prayer chain. We can always use prayer partners,' said Shama. The group meets the third Monday of the month at Catholic Social Services, 529 Kansas City St., Suite 100, Rapid City. 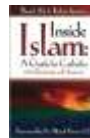

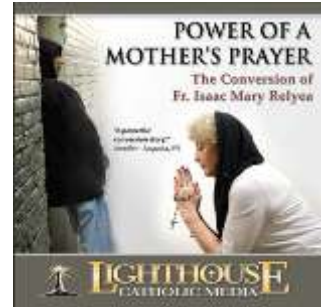
