CSS Palm Sunday BRUNCH ~ March 28th



Dear Parish family,

St Francis de Sales has a wonderful image that illustrates how we should trust in this God who has done so much to gain our trust. He tells us to think of the little children who go on a walk with their dad. With one hand they hold fast to their father, and with the other hand they pick berries, or play with a stick, or throw stones in the pond. I remember when all my siblings went to town, Mom and Dad didn't have enough hands to keep all of us country kids safe, so we didn't stray far. Looking up and not seeing the familiar face in a crowd left me with a sinking feeling and fear.

If we handle the goods, affairs, and problems of this world with one hand, we must always hold fast with the other to our heavenly Father's hand. We should look up at him from time to time to see if we are pleasing him. We do this through prayer and the sacraments, and through obeying his commandments and the teachings of his Church. Isaac, walking with his father Abraham, seemed to experience his father's love. Abraham could not share his disbelief or anxiety with his son. Isaac was spared the knowledge of Abraham's terrible duty, and the angel stayed his hand to announce God's fidelity to Abraham. Therefore, Isaac learned to be faithful to God.

Above all, we should never let go of his hand by direct disobedience to his will or laziness in our spiritual lives. This Lent we are walking with God. Are you looking up to see his face?
