

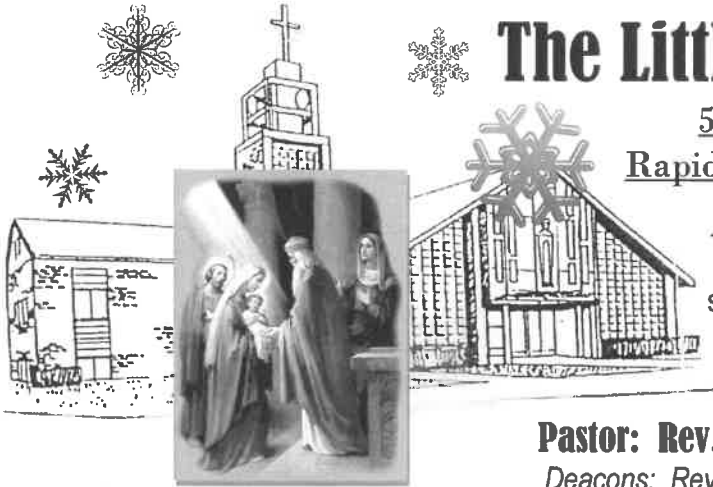

== Fr. Kerry's Korner ==

When the days were completed for their purification according to the law of Moses, Mary and Joseph took Jesus up to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord, just as it is written in the law of the Lord, Every male that opens the womb shall be consecrated to the Lord, and to offer the sacrifice of a pair of turtledoves or two young pigeons, in accordance with the dictate in the law of the Lord. Luke 2.22

The Gospel presents a pair of Jewish rituals that are foreign to most of us, mysterious at best. The time around the birth of a child was a sacred time, as it is today, celebrated by rituals, as today. Since the time of the Passover, the firstborn child was "redeemed", honoring God by the giving of a sacrifice. Joseph was required to do this, presenting him in the synagogue, or for Jesus, in the temple of Jerusalem. This indicated that the child was as special as the whole people of Israel who sacrificed a lamb at the first Passover and thus redeemed their first born when the angel of destruction devastated the first born of the Egyptians. The ritual conveys that every life is sacred.

The second ritual is related to Mary's responsibility and her acknowledgement that she has co-created with God the bringing forth of an infant. She was by law to wait for a time after giving birth to participate in anything in public, especially religious ritual. After that time, she was to offer two sacrifices, the pair of turtledoves, giving thanks for her participation in creation and the sacred gift of her child. The power of the woman's holiness in gestation and birth, by separation, acknowledges the sacredness of human life, and does not overwhelm the offerings of the others in public prayer.

By submitting to these religious laws, Christ verifies the reverential view of human life that they reflect. Every child, every human life, is a gift from God, a participation in the mystery of God's infinite power and unwearied love.

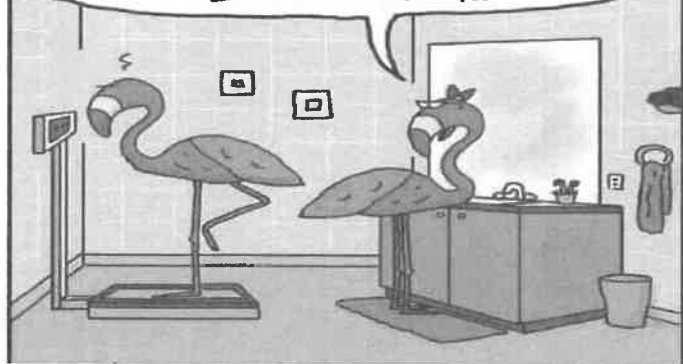

The Institution Narrative, the Consecration, Memorial Acclamation

1. In the continuing recounting of the marvelous deeds of God, we now remember the supreme act of God's gift of salvation, the sacrifice of Jesus on the Cross.
2. We offer thanks as we recall the events of the Last Supper where Jesus instituted this great memorial of his sacrifice.
3. In this moment, the bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Christ. The resurrected Christ is truly and really present before us under the form of bread and wine.
4. This is the moment of great story telling. We are doing what Jesus asked us to do." Do this in memory of me."
5. Our first response to this moment of transubstantiation in the Eucharistic Prayer is complete attention.
6. Bells may be rung during the consecration as a reminder to the faithful of this great moment in the Eucharistic Prayer.
7. The Memorial Acclamation is our second response to this transformation of the bread and wine into the Body and Blood of Christ. We proclaim the death of the Lord and we look forward to the fulfillment of our salvation when Christ comes again.
8. The memorial acclamation is always sung.
