== Fr. Kerry's Korner ==

Behold I send you as sheep in the midst of wolves. Be ye therefore wise as serpents and simple as doves. Mt. 10.16

Dear Friends,

It has been quite a year since the beginning of the pandemic. We are still learning about the virus and how to fight it. We have been tested by a rancorous national election and economic hardships. Our normal way of learning in school, visiting the sick, public prayer, and honoring accomplishments have been changed or adapted, stretching our ingenuity and patience.

We have also elected a Catholic president who may bring fresh energy to a host of social problems that are central to Catholic social teaching on the solidarity of the human family, and protection of the dignity of human life in health, immigration policy, work, the poor, but is sadly wanting in the keystone issue of fetal human rights. We want and expect better from one of our own. I hope this will translate into a desire for better, beginning with ourselves.

We can sometimes feel as Catholics, that we have a target on our back. The scandals in our Church are front page news that take away from the wonderful work being done by parishes in our city, and throughout the Diocese. It also has, in a measurable way, affected our membership, and our relationship with each other in the Diocese of Rapid City. We, the Diocese, are a Catholic community in West River working together to bring services and formation opportunities to our people, while serving the poor, educating our seminarians, bringing healing and counseling to underserved areas, promoting the gospel, offering the sacraments, and many other initiatives.

Because failures of a few clergy have hurt our members, and brought shame upon our Church, we are open to challenges to our authority and mandate to preach the good news, teaching after the heart of Christ, a moral vision that will bring people greater happiness. Because we are diminished in this way the words of St. Matthew, above, should ring loudly in our ears!

We must, I believe, renew our commitment to each other in our parish and our diocese. Our response in community is first a response to the Lord. If we feel that anything or anyone has diminished us, then let us come back stronger with prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. I recently heard a young man from the parish talking about the target on his back referring his number one standing in his weight division. Everyone is after him. He said, "I am not the target. I am the predator." Wow. In my mind I thought we should sign him up for seminary! although I immediately translated it for myself, "I am not the victim. I am the servant of the Lord."

This Lent, among wolves, let us be one, outdoing one another in charity.
