Faithful Citizenship "Edith Stein was born a Jew in what is now Wroclaw, Poland, in 1891. She spent much of her adult life without practicing any religion, but rather based her beliefs on science and philosophy. However, after reading the writings of St. Teresa of Avila, she was quickly converted to Roman Catholicism and was baptized on January 1, 1922. When she was 43 years old, she entered a Carmelite monastery, and became Sister Teresia Benedicta of the Cross. During World War II, the Nazis declared that all Jews, even those who had converted to Catholicism would be put into concentration camps. Since Edith would not renounce her Jewish background, she was sent to Auschwitz with other Jews. Because of her solidarity with the oppressed Jewish people, she too was killed in the gas chambers at Auschwitz. Edith Stein is now recognized as a martyr and saint of the Roman Catholic Church. She was canonized by Pope John Paul II in 1998 and is known as St. Teresa Benedict of the Cross." 

An Update from the Hope For New Life (HFNL) Jail Ministry **Sharen LaGrande's Story**

Continuing with our ministry members' testimonials for joining HFNL, this is Sharen's story: "My journey to volunteer for HFNL started a few years ago. I received from my daughter a book by Matthew Kelly, Rediscover Catholicism. My children had been raised and baptized in the Catholic Church, but I never formally joined the church. Most of my adult life I worshiped in the Wesleyan Church. My daughter didn't realize when she gave me the book that I had felt an urging in my heart to return to the Catholic Church. After reading Rediscover Catholicism, I was certain that God was leading me back to the Catholic Church. Whenever I would visit my daughter and her family, I would go to Mass with them. Therefore, I wasn't totally uncomfortable when I decided to start attending Mass in Rapid City and completed the RCIA program.




