= Fr. Kerry's Korner =

Dear friends.

Isaiah 60:1-6, is chosen as today's first reading, partly because it mentions non-Jews bringing gifts in homage to the God of Israel. Here the Prophet Isaiah, consoling the people in exile, speaks of the restoration of the New Jerusalem from which the glory of Yahweh becomes visible even to the pagan nations. Thus, the prophet in this passage celebrates the Divine Light emanating from Jerusalem and foresees all the nations acknowledging that Light, enjoying that Light and walking by that Light. As a sign of gratitude for the priceless lessons of Faith offered by Jerusalem, the nations will bring wealth by land and sea, especially gold for the Temple and frankincense for the sacrifice.

The Magi exemplify the fulfillment of the Isaiah's prophecy. They embarked on a journey of faith, following the star of Bethlehem until they reached the manger where Jesus laid. They brought gifts that symbolized their revelation of his divinity: gold, which associated Jesus as a king. Frankincense, which was often used in worship, and symbolized the holiness of Jesus. And myrrh, a perfume used for preparing bodies for burial, which symbolized that Christ would one day die for our sins.

The Magi represent all of us, people of every race. and nation, and tongue. This feast reminds us that Christ has come to cast light for all people. All people may respond as the Magi to the news of the birth of Jesus; they may adore the Lord. The Gospel tells us that some responded with hatred, seeking the death of the child, and some would respond with indifference. If we desire to adore the newborn king of the Jews, the Christ, let us respond with gifts of our own. Let us offer the gift of peace: peace in reconciliation with others. peace in speech and generosity, peace in desires.




