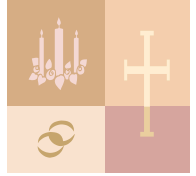

Recently I was asked by a funeral director to play at a graveside service for a homeless man. He had no family or friends, so the service was to be at a pauper's cemetery in the Eldorado Hills backcountry. As I was not familiar with the backwoods, I got lost on the way and, being a typical man, I didn't stop for directions. I finally arrived an hour late and saw the funeral guy had evidently gone and the hearse was nowhere in sight. There were only the grave-diggers and crew left and they were eating lunch. I felt badly and apologized to the men for being late. I went to the side of the grave and looked down and the vault lid was already in place. I didn't know what else to do, so I started to play. The workers put down their lunches and began to gather around. I played out my heart and soul for this man with no family and friends. I played like I've never played before for this homeless man. And as I played Amazing Grace, the workers began to weep. They wept, I wept, we all wept together. When I finished, I packed up my bagpipes and started for my car. Though my head hung low, my heart was full. As I opened the door to my car, I heard one of the workers say, "I never seen nothing like that before and I've been putting in septic tanks for twenty years."

Apparently I'm still lost....it's a man thing.

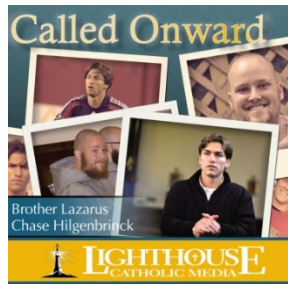

ONE MORE FUNNY ...from Father Bill

No nursing home for us. We'll be checking into a Holiday Inn!
With the average cost for a nursing home care costing \$188.00 per day, there is a better way when we get old and too feeble. I've already checked on reservations at the Holiday Inn. For a combined long term stay discount and senior discount, it's \$59.23 per night. Breakfast is included, and some have happy hours in the afternoon. That leaves \$128.77 a day for lunch and dinner in any restaurant we want, or room service, laundry, gratuities and special TV movies. While you're at the airport, fly somewhere. Otherwise, the cash keeps building up. It takes months to get into decent nursing homes. Holiday Inn will take your reservation today. And you're not stuck in one place forever -- you can move from Inn to Inn, or even from city to city. Want to see Hawaii? They have Holiday Inn there too. TV broken? Light bulbs need changing? Need a mattress replaced? No problem... They fix everything, and apologize for the inconvenience. The Inn has a night security person and daily room service. The maid checks to see if you are OK. If not, they'll call an ambulance . . . or the undertaker. If you fall and break a hip, Medicare will pay for the hip, and Holiday Inn will upgrade you to a suite for the rest of your life. And no worries about visits from family. They will always be glad to find you and probably check in for a few days mini-vacation. The grandkids can use the pool.
What more could I ask for? So, when I reach that golden age,
I'll face it with a grin.

Veritatis Splendor Institute

This fall, the diocese will begin a new diocesan program of certification for catechists, the *Veritatis Splendor Institute* (VSI), named for Bl. Pope John Paul II's great encyclical, *The Splendor of Truth*. The goal of the VSI is the mission of the Church, that of proclaiming the Gospel to all people, and bringing people to a deeper encounter with Jesus Christ. This program will be an opportunity to grow as evangelists and teachers. The VSI will provide courses of instruction in the content of the Faith, catechetical methodology, classroom management, and courses for particular apostolates or ministries: youth ministry, RCIA, liturgy, music, retreats, adult education, children's catechesis, and more! The program will also offer formation in prayer, spirituality, and discipleship. The VSI will offer a Basic Level Certification (one-year program), and a Master

Level Certification (two-year program, following after completion of Basic Certification), with courses offered once a month on Saturdays. If you are interested in this program of catechist certification, you can request an Information Packet with Application Form from your pastor, or from the Office of Faith Formation (ssafford@diorc.org, 605-716-5214 x230). 
