

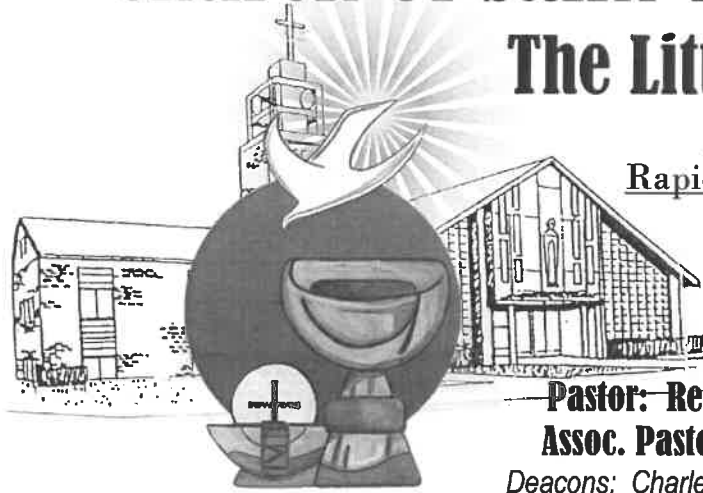

Dear Friends in Christ,

Today we celebrate the foundational truth of our faith, The Body and Blood of Christ, with Mass, processions, and adoration. Jesus' promise to remain with us always is fulfilled in this Sacrament of his Presence. This past week many people came to the Church with fears, anxieties, and problems out of their control and they found in the Blessed Sacrament Chapel a quiet presence that gave them respite and healing. God desires that we take time away for prayer and silence. In that silence sometimes he is profoundly made known.

Sometimes we look to our past to make sense of our present. We see God preparing us for greater truths and increased intimacy. Moses drilled into the Israelites that manna was a food unknown to their fathers. He was reminding them never to forget the gift they had received. Among Catholics, there is ignorance regarding the true significance and importance of the Eucharist. If we truly understood the Eucharist for what it is, or, rather, for who it is, every Mass would be full, as well as every line for confessions, and every sign-up sheet for Eucharistic adoration.

It all starts with simply sharing, even with our fellow Catholics, the fact that Our Lord is the Eucharist, and he wants to be with us. In the Eucharist, God is always with us. How many people do you think you'd amaze by saying, "I know where God is, come see"? He'll reveal himself to anyone who gives him a chance in faith.

May your Sabbath day of rest provide you with good time and leisure to meet the Lord.

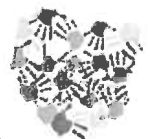

"Processions can be a powerful way to renew and rediscover both belief in the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist as well as the missionary call that every Catholic shares: to bring Jesus to the world." (Knights of Columbus Procession Guide).

Those participating in a Eucharistic Procession proclaim by their actions their desire to follow Jesus and share Him with those around them.
