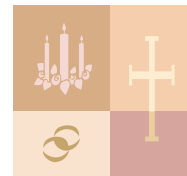

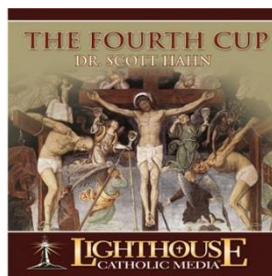

Opportunity of a Lifetime The Hope For New Life jail ministry has two components. First, a group of 10-12 people who take turns visiting the jail every Wednesday evening. Second, a dedicated group of approximately 40 prayer partners. Over the last six months, an abundance of worldly challenges (sickness, accidents, hardships) have reduced the number of those who do the Wednesday visits to 8-9 people. The necessity to ask for new volunteers is also a wonderful opportunity for the person who is seeking a way to share his/her faith! This situation may be an invitation from the Holy Spirit to **YOU**, Dear Reader, to prayerfully consider joining our ministry.
