Rather it should help them contribute more effectively to social well-being and supplement their activity when the demands of justice exceed their capacities. This does not mean, however, that the government that governs least, governs best. Rather it defines good government intervention as that which truly "helps" other social groups contribute to the common good by directing, urging, restraining, and regulating economic activity as" the occasion requires and necessity demands". Paul Yantes' Testimony On occasion we like to share with you our Hope For New Life (HFNL) members' testimonials about their reasons for joining our ministry.
