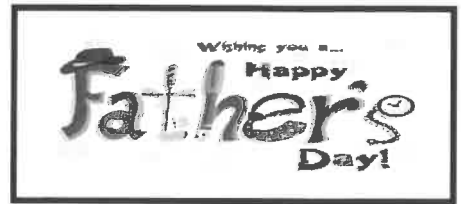

Dear Friends in Christ,

One week from Tuesday, at the Cathedral of Our Lady of Perpetual Help, Joshua Lee of our parish will be ordained to the Diaconate in preparation for his priestly ordination next year. Before he makes the promises to Bishop Peter regarding his ministerial life as a deacon, he makes the promise of celibacy. In this way, at least, the ordination of a Transitional Deacon is the more momentous of the two rites, and therefore, memorable. It is then that the man expresses two of the greatest gifts a person possesses: free choice and resolve. Read and reflect on the words below from the Rite of Ordination to the Order of Deacon. *By your own free choice, you seek to enter the order of deacons. You shall exercise this ministry in the celibate state for celibacy is both a sign, and a motive of pastoral charity, and a special source of spiritual fruitfulness in the world. By living in this state with total dedication, moved by a sincere love for Christ the Lord, you are consecrated to him in a new and special way. By this consecration, you will adhere more easily to Christ with an undivided heart; you will be more freely at the service of God and mankind, and you will be more untrammelled in the ministry of Christian conversion and rebirth. By your life and character, you will give witness to your brothers and sisters in faith that God must be loved above all else, and that it is he, whom you serve in others. Therefore, I ask you: in the presence of God and the Church, are you resolved as a sign of your interior dedication to Christ, to remain celibate for the sake of the kingdom and in lifelong service to God and mankind?*

Your vocation will likely have required different promises, but we can all relate to the gift of a freely chosen vocation born from love and directed to service and sacrifice. Josh has learned resolve from his preparation for his job in agriculture, his battles with cancer, and the recognition of his call to service in the Church. Surely your vocation, even today, must be freely chosen each morning, and the resolve to live it renewed. The vocation to Holy Orders is similar to marriage or to Consecrated Life for all these vocations necessitate the resolve to love and remain in love with the Beloved.

Let us pray and fast for deacon candidate Josh Lee this week. Remember, you are invited to his ordination at the Cathedral June 29, 11 a.m., by the Most Reverend Peter Muhich. Josh will also preach his first homily at the daily mass at St. Therese, Wednesday June 30 at 7:30 a.m.
