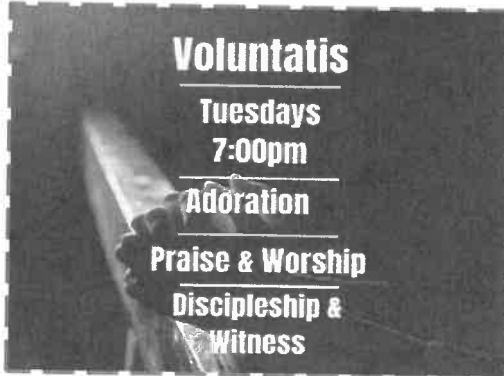

"And whoever gives only a cup of cold water to one of these little ones to drink because the little one is a disciple—amen, I say to you, he will surely not lose his reward."

Matthew 10.42

Someday the student (disciple) will be the master (teacher). Have you seen children trying to imitate their parents? Children will, without guile, follow in their parents' footsteps: mannerisms, language, beliefs, values. In today's gospel Jesus tells us that we should welcome our fellow disciples with hospitality that keeps their basic needs met and helps them along our journey with Christ. When we value and support our teachers, missionaries, and elders in the faith, we are giving them more than a drink of cold water. We are refreshing the spirits that are challenged every day and need encouragement. Our children, who may one day desire to be the next missionary, consecrated sister, or priest will be growing up with the knowledge that they are not alone.

The hospitality shown to Elisha the prophet, the cool drink given to a thirsty disciple, are both rewarded in the stories. Elisha promises the childless woman a son, which came to pass. The ones who show kindness to a righteous man receives the reward of the righteous. I was taught that doing a kindness was its own reward. That seemed to imply that we didn't need anything for doing what was right. That is true. But the disciple will, nonetheless, receive a reward. Is it growth in holiness? Perhaps it is a relationship that will return a blessing to us or to our family. I think it is, in part, a deepening of trust. God will always be there for me. My offering to God will always be received. I cannot lay down my life without the Father blessing me and raising me to greater life.

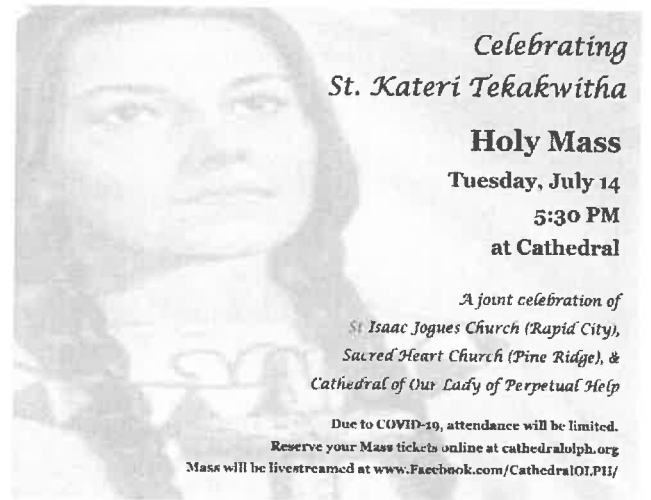
