== Fr. Kerry's Korner ==

While they were eating, he took bread, said the blessing, broke it, gave it to them, and said, "Take it; this is my body."

Then he took a cup, gave thanks, and gave it to them, and they all drank from it.

He said to them, "This is my blood of the covenant, which will be shed for many."

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ, Corpus Christi. The Mass is the remembrance of Jesus Christ on the altar until he comes again in glory. It is also a communion with the Body and Blood of Jesus, and therefore a communion with the Father. Our Eucharist is, in the words of Jesus, real food and real drink, food for the journey.

Catholics believe in the Real Presence, that the Eucharist is changed to the substance of the Christ while remaining in appearance, taste, and smell as normal unleavened bread. When Jesus told his disciples this truth, and that unless they "eat my body and drink my blood you will not have life within you," many said, "This is a hard saying. Who can endure it." They left. Because so many of our fellow Christians do not believe that the Eucharist is real food and real drink, i.e. his Body and Blood, the Catholic Church practices a closed communion, for Catholics only. Others may be admitted to communion under certain conditions and with speaking to their pastor, but normally the Eucharist is a sacrament for the fully initiated.

By this discipline the Church is saying that our Communion is a real sign and source of unity with one meaning, divinely given by Christ at the last supper. We don't assign our private meaning to it (that it is a symbol only) but we receive it as it was given by the Lord. The grace and unity are from Jesus' Real Presence, not our subjective feelings projected on the moment or encounter.

Mark Shea, a convert to Catholicism reminds us that the encounter with Jesus is not for us alone: "For in the Catholic communion we commune not only with Christ but with each other. Our participation in the Body of Christ is not only Eucharistic, but ecclesial. To be united with the Head is to be united with his Body. To be members of Christ is to be 'members of one another' (Romans 12:5). The next time you go to Mass, remember your solidarity with the Body of Christ, and make a point of really trying to greet and get to know somebody new."

Excellent advice! Let us go to live our Eucharist.

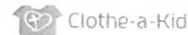
ONE MORE LITTLE LAUGH...

I am not so sure I could have the amount of Faith these men and women have if I was incarcerated. I sincerely believe these men and women we minister to get some of this Faith from our HFNL ministers. Never take for granted what you do or say when we are at the jail each Wednesday."
