An Update from the Hope For New Life (HFNL) Jail Ministry Paul Yantes' Testimony On occasion we like to share with you our Hope For New Life (HFNL) members' testimonials about their reasons for joining our ministry. This month Paul Yantes from the Parish of Our Lady of Perpetual Help explains his decision: "I first heard of the HFNL Jail ministry two or three years before I actually joined.
