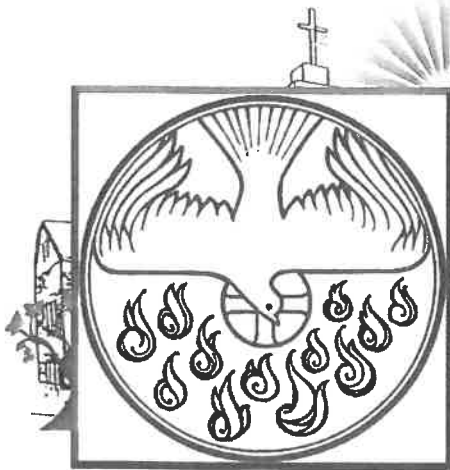

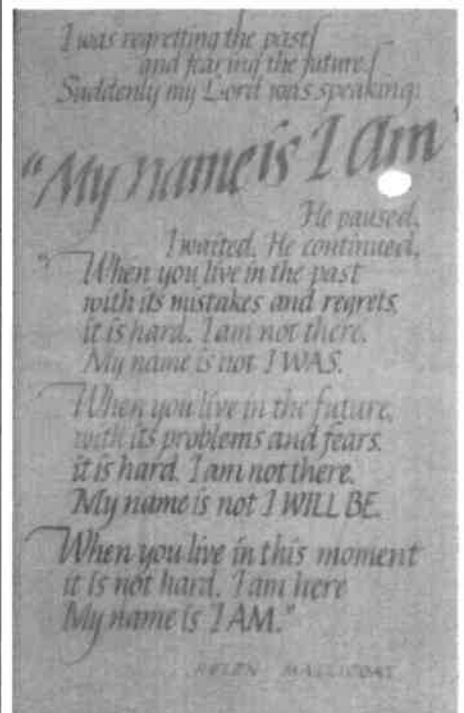

== *Fr. Francis's File* ==

WHO IS FR. FRANCIS NSUBUGA?

The Lord is good? All the time, and all the time the Lord is good and that is nature waawool!

To begin with, I am a Ugandan Catholic priest who joined the diocese of Rapid City with his brother priest, Leonard, at the Cathedral on 19th March 2022. It was through the good relationship with the Diocese of Rapid City and Kiyinda Mityana for me to be here. I thank the two Bishops of our dioceses, Joseph and Peter, and all the priests for accepting us to serve in this Diocese.

I was born of John Nsubuga, who named me after his name Nsubuga. It is believed in my tribe for a dad to share his name with his child is a sign of love to the child and some special birth rites go with it. So, I was a lovely son of my dad. My mom was Annet who loved me so much and I remember her blessing when I was still a child contributing to my being a priest. She gave to three male children and I am the second born. She was married in the Church to my dad. She died in her 30s of breast cancer. RIP mom! I am from a family of 27 siblings, 22 still alive and 5 are deceased leaving children behind.

After the death of my lovely mom, life changed because I was used to her love for me! She died when I was at the age of 10. We stayed with the step mom Mary, who was a very good step mom. At the age of 13, I went to live with my grandmom, Therese, who did a wonderful job towards my education. I used to stay with her helping to slash the compound using a machete! My Aunt Sofia visited us one day and found the compound well-maintained and asked my grandma who did the maintenance. She told her that it was me. My dad had no money for school fees, so my aunt promised to pay for my fees to go. I am so grateful to her.

My home background was not all that good, because my parents brought us up in a funny and miserable house, which I did not like right from childhood. I would always pray to God to help me study to uplift the status of my parents house, which I did, and I thank God.

My school life also had a very humble beginning as many of the schools in Uganda. I started under the shade of a mango tree, no chairs to sit on, but sitting on stone if you could get one because we would fight for them. We did not have books and pencils. We had to write on the ground using sticks with one teacher for over a hundred kids. I did not have shoes to wear and had no breakfast or lunch. I only ate in the evening. Life changed a little better when I joined St. Luke, a Parish School, but it was also far away from home. I had to walk 3 miles in the morning and 3 miles in the evening every day.

To cut the story short, the Hand of God has been upon me right from childhood. I loved and trusted God right from childhood because my parents prepared me to do so. I was an altar server, taking readings, youth leader both at the church and village level, attended youth retreats, and was a boy scout.

Love of becoming a priest sprung from the catechism book we used to have at home and it was bearing pictures of a priest holding the bread of the Eucharist. When I was 6, I would always admire the pictures in that book, not knowing it would

become a reality. I entered St. Mbaaga's Major Seminary after my secondary studies at St. Joseph's. I was 22. Now I have diplomas and Bachelor degrees in Philosophy and Sacred Theology. I was ordained a diocesan priest in 2009.

All my parents are deceased and I am the successor of my dad. My responsibility back home is to take care of my extended family left behind by my parents. One may ask how do you manage? The only answer I have is: with God everything is possible.

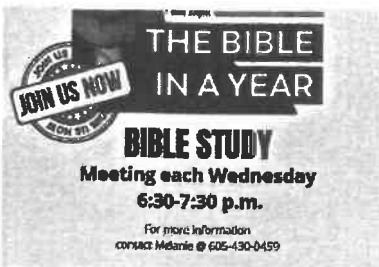
Encounter the Holy Spirit at Pennington County Jail
