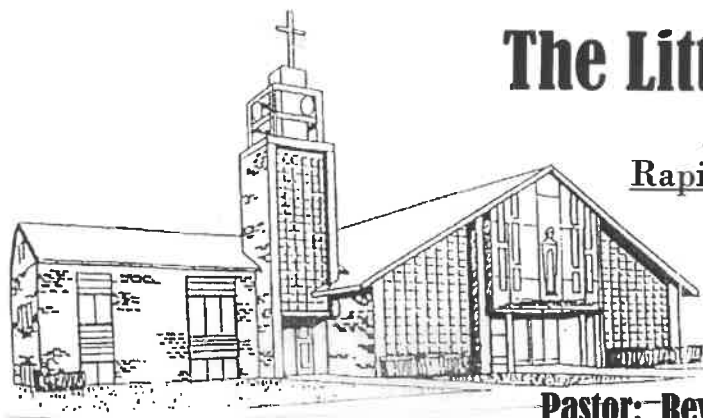

Faithful Citizenship Excerpts from A Catholic Framework for Economic Life *As followers of Jesus Christ and participants in a powerful economy, Catholics in the United States are called to work for greater economic justice in the face of persistent poverty, growing income-gaps, and increasing discussion of economic issues in the United States and around the world. We urge Catholics to use the following ethical framework for economic life as principles for reflection, criteria for judgment and directions for action. These principles are drawn directly from Catholic teaching on economic life.*

1. The economy exists for the person, not the person for the economy.
2. All economic life should be shaped by moral principles. Economic choices and institutions must be judged by how they protect or undermine the life and dignity of the human person, support the family and serve the common good.
3. A fundamental moral measure of any economy is how the poor and vulnerable are faring.

== Fr. Kerry's Korner ==

Recent events in the political world have assailed the consciences of everyone who values human life. New York state's recent legislation allowing terminating pregnancies at any point before birth, coupled with the movie Gosnell, have horrified some and angered most. There does not seem to be any form of ethics at play, at least regarding objective good and evil, other than a vague reference to privacy.

Certainly, there are grievous deficiencies in law-making that fails to first determine if something is good or bad for people, or evil in itself. Many laws have been passed to codify permission to do things popular or desired by a few without asking if it is even right. Today people may use abortion for any reason, even to choose the sex of their child. In the past, exposure of unwanted infants to the elements was outlawed, but today laws are being passed to allow babies with no other defect than being unwanted, to die of inattention, essentially exposure, after being born live following an abortion procedure.

Christians throughout history have defended the dignity of the unborn and saved unwanted babies through our orphanages, Catholic Charities, and Social Services. Religious sisters in Germany and other places followed their developmentally disabled children and adults to the concentration camps, believing they could care for them in that new place. They died alongside them in the showers. Our heroic witness is needed today as in the past, to be Christ for the unborn, the imperfect, the unwanted, the elderly and the outcast.

Will we always be known as a Church of the poor, the marginalized, protector of human life and dignity? St. Paul reminds us, "Do not conform yourselves to this age but be transformed by the renewal of your mind, that you may discern what is the will of God, what is good and pleasing and perfect."
