
# **Church of Saint Therese**



## = Fr. Kerry's Korner ==

This Sunday is "Laetare [lay-TAHR-ay] Sunday," the Sunday of rejoicing. The rose-colored vestments are a symbol of that joy, like the rose horizon that comes with a beautiful sunrise. We have had four weeks to meditate on our weaknesses and sinful tendencies. And so now we may appreciate more deeply just how full and unconditional God's love is - that while we were "dead in our transgressions" as St Paul put it, God reached down and rescued us.

God's love, God's fidelity, God's mercy does not depend on our worthiness. He doesn't love us because we are perfect; he perfects us because he loves us. "God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life."

St Paul gets even more explicit in today's Second Reading. He points out that our salvation is a "grace" - the Greek word refers to a lovely gift, not something we earn or deserve. He writes: "God... because of the great love he had for us... even when we were dead in our transgressions, brought us to life with Christ.

One of my favorite titles for Mary, mother of Jesus, is Cause of Our Joy, because it reminds us the mercy of God has changed us forever. Her humility and receptiveness let her both, bear the Son of God and be his first disciple. She told us in the gospel, "Do whatever he tells you." Jesus reveals to us the mercy of God; he is the face of God's mercy. St. John Paul II in 1994 said, "Who can say that he is free from sin and does not need God's mercy? As people of this restless time of ours, wavering between the emptiness of self-exaltation and the humiliation of despair, we have a greater need than ever for a regenerating experience of mercy."

So let us receive mercy, be mercy for others, and rejoice in the free gift of God's unbounded love for us.



Year of St. Joseph Indulgences

<u>Granted by the Holy See from December 8, 2020 to December 8, 2021</u>

<u>Below is a summary of how you can receive the special indulgences</u>

granted by the Holy See for the Year of St. Joseph


A Plenary indulgence is granted under the customary conditions (sacramental confession, Eucharistic communion and prayer according to the intentions of the Holy Father) to the faithful who, with a soul detached from any sin, shall participate in the Year of Saint Joseph in any of the following ways:

- Meditate for 30 minutes on the Our Father
- Participate on a 1-day retreat with a meditation on St. Joseph
- Perform corporal and/or spiritual works of mercy
- Recite the Holy Rosary as a couple or with family members
- Pray the Litany of St. Joseph
- Recite any approved prayer in honor of St. Joseph, especially on the days dedicated to St. Joseph: March 19, May 1, the 19th of every month, and on any Wednesday.
- Entrust their work daily to the protection of St. Joseph
- Invoke, with their prayers, the intercession of St. Joseph

The gift of the plenary indulgence extends particularly to:

- The elderly
- The sick
- The dying
- All those who for legitimate reasons cannot leave their homewho, with the spirit detached from any sin and with the intention of fulfilling, as soon as possible, the three usual conditions, pray an act of piety in honor Saint Joseph, confidently offering God the pains and difficulties of their lives.

Definition of Indulgences: A plenary indulgence means that by the merits of Jesus Christ, The Blessed Virgin Mary, and all the saints, the full remission of the temporal punishment due to sacramentally forgiven sins is obtained. The person becomes as if just baptized and would fly immediately to heaven if he died in that instant. A partial indulgence means that a portion of the temporal punishment due to forgiven sin is remitted. Indulgences can be applied to oneself or to a deceased loved one, but not to another living person.


