## **== Fr. Kerry's Korner ==**

When Bishop Gruss opened the Year of the Eucharist on the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ on June 23 last year, no one could anticipate the crosses we would be bearing during Lent 2020. It was providential that we began to study and deepen our love for Christ in the Sacrament of his Body and Blood. If you have not followed the teachings in the church and in the bulletin, you may catch up any time by going to the link on the diocesan web page for Year of the Eucharist. In the current crisis with the Covid-19 virus our desire for the Eucharist and the realities of the health crisis are in heartbreaking conflict.

Many dioceses across the country, and most in our region have suspended public celebration of the Mass and other religious services. We are following the CDC guidelines for gathering in groups and eliminating ways that the virus can spread. Your priests are still praying for you as your spiritual father in private masses and asking for protection and healing for all affected. We hope you will follow the Scripture reading of the Church and join in streaming or televised Masses (see bulletin for details). In effect the suffering of the Church this Lent, the penance of the Faithful is a "fast of the Eucharist." We hope and pray it will be of short duration. One response to this unchosen fast is to pray and make a spiritual communion.

Spiritual communion is an old tradition, especially in mission lands where they have never been able to have Mass every Sunday. It is a communion of desire that unites us spiritually to the celebration, merits and even the fruits of the Mass and the Eucharist. St. John Paul II wrote in his encyclica, *Ecclesia de Eucharistia*, "In the Eucharist, "unlike any other sacrament, the mystery [of communion] is so perfect that it brings us to the heights of every good thing: Here is the ultimate goal of every human desire, because here we attain God and God joins himself to us in the most perfect union." Precisely for this reason it is good to cultivate in our hearts a constant desire for the sacrament of the Eucharist. This was the origin of the practice of "spiritual communion," which has happily been established in the Church for centuries and recommended by saints who were masters of the spiritual life. St. Teresa of Avila wrote: "When you do not receive communion and you do not attend Mass, you can make a spiritual communion, which is a most beneficial practice; by it the love of God will be greatly impressed on you" [The Way of Perfection, Ch. 35.]. According to Saint Thomas Aquinas spiritual communion consists of "an ardent desire to receive Jesus in the Holy Sacrament and a loving embrace as though we had already received Him."

I have put a prayer form for Spiritual Communion on my Facebook page (so please like me!) and the Facebook page for St. Therese Church. Essentially read and pray with the Scripture of the day and then pray from your heart or with the Spiritual Communion prayer found in this bulletin.

## **Communion**

Sharing in the Eucharist is the high point of the entire celebration. Holy Communion seals the sacrificial nature of the meal in which we remember Christ's Passover. The Church teaches that the Eucharist is the source and summit of our Christian life. Receiving Holy Communion is the most intimate moment of this encounter with the Lord Jesus. He gives himself to us completely, body, blood, soul and divinity; his totality. He can't give any more of himself to us. This is the most intimate union possible. There is no greater love. We respond to the invitation to receive communion as the Roman centurion did when Jesus offered to come to his home. We are "not worthy to have him enter under our roof." In order to enter this union, we, though sinners, must open our hearts to this profound love for us. We are not receiving just a consecrated host, we are receiving Jesus himself, and therefore his saving, sacrificial love.

## **Faithful Citizenship**

***"Take no part in the fruitless works of  
darkness; rather expose them, for it is shameful even to mention the things  
done by them in secret; but everything exposed by the light becomes  
visible, for everything that becomes visible is light."***

Abortion is an evil. And like any evil, participating in abortion results in painful consequences. Rachel's Vineyard retreats work to bring hope and healing to those who have been directly impacted by abortion, but cooperation with abortion extends far beyond direct participation. Working for or shopping at a company which supports abortion is a form of cooperation with abortion. So is donating to a charity which supports abortion or voting or a candidate who supports abortion. Even receiving vaccines which have been formulated with cells derived from aborted fetuses is a form of remote cooperation. Yet avoiding all these situations can be difficult, if not impossible. How do we avoid these forms of remote cooperation? Take courage and speak up. Speak with conviction, but also with love and compassion, remembering that often, the most advocates for abortion, have experienced this painful decision for themselves. Write to CEO's but also share this information with your neighbor. Encourage ethical research to develop ethical vaccines. Become informed and choose an alternative to shop, or invest, or to cast your ballot. And then, let them know why they won't be receiving your business, or your vote. **Advocating Against Despair** To be isolated and cut off from family and loved ones is surely the most difficult and trying condition anyone can face. Feelings of isolation and despair are therefore very real to the inmates of Pennington County Jail. Consider this recent prayer from a male inmate from one of our recent Wednesday groups: "Dear Heavenly Father, I pray for my wife and I pray for my kids... that [we] will be together again. Lord, please help me with my troubles and my sorrows. I shed tears for [my family] every day. Fix my life. Teach me your ways, Father. Amen." It is precisely in such a seemingly hopeless situation that Our Lord can reach out through His Holy Spirit, providing salvation, love and hope to those who would otherwise despair. Jesus assures us of the gift of the Holy Spirit, the Advocate and Spirit of Truth: "He lives with you and will be in you. I will not leave you as orphans; I will come to you....Because I live, you also will live...you are in me and I am in you (John 14: 17-20)." HFNL was established for the express purpose of bringing Our Lord's Good News to our imprisoned brothers and sisters. During each of our weekly jail visits, our message to the men and women is always one of Hope: The Lord will guide us in our deepest struggles, forgive our sins, hear our prayers, and shoulder the burdens we cannot bear. *If you would like to learn more about our ministry, please contact Bill Gradoville 605 430-2697.
