



Go to the Cathedral web site (<u>www.Cathedralolph.org/adoration</u>) or use (<u>www.500catholics.com</u>) and sign your name, email address and phone number and select an hour in the week that will work for you. Your information will be confidential and the only persons who will receive your name and phone number will be the other two people you are praying with during your hour. The web site also has a calendar that lists the hours of each week and how many (not the names) are signed up for each hour.

If you do not use the internet, you can call the Cathedral rectory (342-0507) and sign up by giving us your name, email address and phone number. Your info. will be confidential. Your name and phone number will only be shared with the other two people who are praying with you during your selected hour.

Finally you can sign up on the sheets at the entrance of the church. These will be collected and sent to the Cathedral and you will be notified concerning the others who are signed up with you.
