Dear Parish family,

It has been surreal observing the social distancing necessary to fight this disease. As a parish we have been moving more to social media and to the phones to keep in touch. I have been very active in the hospital this week and with patients in the hospice. The procedures are changing for these ministries to make sure we keep healthy and not carry infection along. Communion visits to the homebound have stopped, and I only bring the Eucharist as viaticum to the sick. As I write this Holy Week is being discussed, but I am almost certain we will observe it in private.

This Lent has been an extraordinary test. I would never have thought my people would be asked to observe a fast of the Eucharist. I have been remembering you, the sick, caregivers in the medical community, and others in my daily Mass. I have also been trying to put more useful or spiritually rewarding posts on Facebook. I may even try streaming a mass from St. Therese in the near future. ~ Seeking help making masks for the COVID-19 PANDEMIC ~

Parishioners, I am putting together a city-wide project for making protective masks. We are in a pandemic crisis and I need your help. We need masks for: Hospitals, Urgent Care Centers, Nursing Homes, Assistant living, Fire Fighters, EMT's, Police, Highway Patrol, all 1st Responders, the elderly living with their family, the homeless shelters, women's shelter, jail, juvenile detention center, churches, grocery stores. Anyone who needs one. I think we could get many in town to help sew at home. There will be a video link to watch, the materials will be ready to sew and all you must do is sew. They do not need to be perfect. I will send you the link. No computer, directions will be delivered. We will have the material cut with all needed elastic or ties included. We need a few to cut materials out for each mask, put them in a labeled container. This will be in the church basement. Please do not have symptoms. If you have any extra cotton material (no matter the color or design) with a tight weave. 1/8" flat elastic. extra thread (no matter the color). Small clean cardboard boxes or plastic containers with lids are needed. I will pick it up, call or email me! God bless you! We also would need people to pick up and deliver supplies, masks, to answer emails and phone calls (from their homes), coordinator for all, to help put deliveries together-label, help getting materials and supplies from stores. Let us know. and we will pick up. The hospital will be able to sanitize all the masks for use. We need talented people who could make plastic face shields, if you know how, please call or email. Anyone can help. They do not have to be Catholic or even religious. This is a city and statewide crisis!! I am planning on putting this on tv and in the journal and on Facebook.
