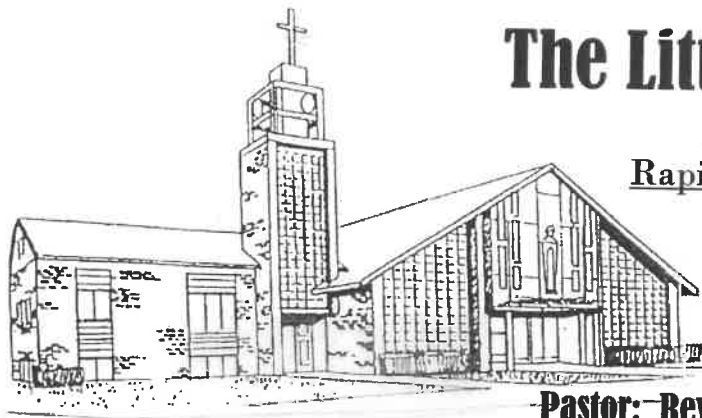

Faithful Citizenship Assisted Suicide and Euthanasia: From

Voluntary to Involuntary While promoted in the name of personal autonomy, physician-assisted suicide (providing lethal drugs so patients can take their own lives) and euthanasia (direct killing of patients by doctors) do not remain limited to cases in which the victim gave his or her voluntary consent. This agenda ultimately embraces coercion and the death of unwilling victims.

The Case of the Netherlands Since 1973 a series of court decisions has established that Dutch doctors need not fear punishment or prosecution if they kill, or assist the suicides of, patients in "unbearable suffering" who make a voluntary request to die. When the Dutch government studied actual practice in 1991, it found:

- 2300 cases of voluntary euthanasia every year; 400 assisted suicides; and 1040 cases in which doctors killed patients without their knowledge or consent.
- In this last category, 72% of the patients had never expressed an interest in having their lives taken, and 14% were fully competent.
- In addition, 8100 patients died from overdoses of pain medications intended primarily to end life rather than relieve pain, and 61% of the time (4941 cases) this was done without the patient's consent.

== Fr. Kerry's Korner ==

Dear Friends,

What a beautiful week we have had with the temperate weather and the beauty of the discipline of Lent. We also had the extraordinary opportunity to pray and reverence the incorrupt heart of St. Jean Vianney, patron of priests and seminarians. This tour, a pilgrimage in reverse, allows the faithful who cannot travel to France to pray with the saint. Joe Bollinger says of this devotion, "The heart receives special veneration because in Scripture it is considered to be a person's hidden center of emotional, intellectual and moral activity. Saint John Vianney is said to have lived his life according to the heart of Christ and united his heart to Christ's."

The Church of St. John in Ft. Pierre and the Cathedral of Our Lady of Perpetual Help, in hosting the devotion, honored the saint by facilitating what St. Jean was known for: hearing confessions, giving instruction in the faith, and hearing confessions. In the evening we priests gathered for some time together and a meal together at the Cathedral.

A relic can be the body, a piece of tissue or clothing from a saint. Catholics revere these objects in relationship to the saint and their faithfulness to Christ. Recall how the woman with the hemorrhage told herself, "If only I touch the hem of his (Christ's) cloak I shall get well. There are many other examples in the scripture, beginning in the Old Testament when contact with a holy person brought people to life or to healing. When I revered the heart of St. Jean Vianney, I prayed that I would always seek to have the heart of Jesus for those who are hurting most.

To reverence a relic, some people kiss the reliquary holding the relic or simply pray in its presence. I encourage you to venerate the relics of our Holy patron St. Therese the Little Flower at her shrine in the back of Church. For our sister parish of St. John the Evangelist in New Underwood, I encourage you to kiss the Gospel of John in your bible.

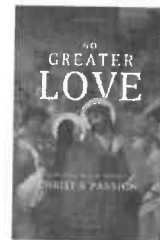

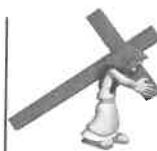

Prison Encounter: Sharing the Lord's Prayer

Our Wednesday evening encounters with the inmates of Pennington County Jail are as spiritually moving for us as they are for those to whom we minister. To illustrate this truth, consider the following testimony from HFNL ministry member **Sharen Lagrande** following the February 20, 2019 session: "We opened our program by playing a CD by Dr. Scott Hahn: **"Understanding the Lord's Prayer."** I have often prayed and asked God to help me see Christ in other people. I have to admit I have struggled with this. But after listening to Dr. Hahn, especially his talk about the beginning of the prayer, "Our Father" and not "My Father," I had an awareness of how God sees us as a family, and also wants us to pray as a family. We are truly brothers and sisters in Christ. It was a very powerful moment for me. I am still very touched by the hand of God bringing to my awareness how a simple shift in our focus can open our hearts to feel and express God's love. Wow! What a moment."
