== Fr. Kerry's Korner ==

Dear Friends,

Unless we regularly pray with Scripture, especially the Gospels, we will likely fall into a pattern of creating a one-dimensional image of Jesus. Jesus who can be appreciated more than loved, who can be managed for our comfort. The evangelist John records an event and the temple, which is also told in the other three Gospels, that shows us Jesus did not come to be managed. The cleansing of the temple was intended to challenge his people, the chosen, to look upon the intent as well as the letter of the law.

Managing Jesus, in my view, means taking what we find easy or palatable while rejecting teaching that requires bending our will or accepting discomfort. For some it is easy to give a tithe or gift but not change an immoral situation or injustice that they could end. John reminds us that Jesus needed no one to help him understand human nature; he knew it well.

Do we know ourselves as well as Jesus knows us? Probably not. But we have time (usually) and God's patience and grace on our side. Doing one good thing can cancel out a multitude of sins. Making good deeds habitual changes our life. We can develop the eye that sees the needs around us, and more readily be content with a sufficiency instead of many toys and distractions.

Once, when Jesus had no whip in his hand, he said, "Woe to you, teachers of the law and Pharisees, you hypocrites! You give a tenth of your spices—mint, dill and cumin. But you have neglected the more important matters of the law—justice, mercy and faithfulness. You should have practiced the latter, without neglecting the former." Mt. 23:23 It takes our best intentions and discernment to live a rounded, happy, and blessed life. Time, Talent, and Treasure are three categories to think about what we do. The Gospels are the source for us to find and live the blessed life. Prayer, fasting, and almsgiving, will help us clear our head and open our heart to Christ.

A letter from the Bishop...

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

During the weekend of March 13-14, our diocese will take up the Catholic Relief Services Collection. Your support of this collection serves Jesus in disguise in some of the most

marginalized communities in our world.

One of the ministries supported through the collection is the Apostleship of the Sea. Sailors, fishers, harbor workers, and their families have unique pastoral needs because of mariners' long periods away from home. In addition to access to the Eucharist and other sacraments on ships, seafarers also need hospitality and pastoral care in port cities. For the past hundred years, Stella Maris—also called Apostleship of the Sea—has ministered to the pastoral needs of mariners through chaplaincies and centers in port cities. This apostleship currently serves the mariners through chaplaincies and centers in port cities. This apostleship currently serves the community with more than 100 chaplains and lay ministers in 48 ports across the United States.

In November 2019, 21 bishops, 11 apostleship chaplains, and lay ministers and staff from the United States conference of Catholic Bishops' Subcommittee on Pastoral Care of Migrants, Refugees, and Travelers (PCMRT) gathered to discuss the experiences and challenges of chaplains and how best to take on the challenges of maritime ministry. They invited bishops to engage in efforts to raise awareness of the Apostleship of the Sea in their own dioceses. By connecting chaplains with bishops, the apostleship can address challenges in the maritime world and continue to meet the needs of mariners and their families.
