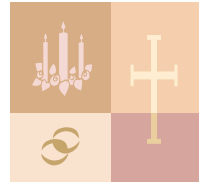

An Update from the Hope For New Life (HFNL) Jail Ministry Why I Joined HFNL

We would like to share with you over the coming months some of the stories behind our ministry members' decisions to join HFNL. Our hope is that our testimonials will strike some sympathetic chords with you so that you might decide to join us in this exciting ministry. My name is Ken and I worship at the Cathedral. I joined HFNL in 2010. I was looking for some meaningful volunteer work which would help others. I was introduced to HFNL Ministry at Sunday Mass through an informational presentation by one of the ministry members. Here was an opportunity to share the Gospel with those most in need of Our Lord's love and redemption. There was also the "there but for the grace of God" factor. Many years ago due to an act of poor judgment and selfishness, I was arrested for driving while intoxicated and spent two hours in jail. Being locked up for even that short amount of time was devastating. The overpowering feelings of shame, fear, and loneliness I experienced left me with a never-to-be-forgotten impression. I remember this experience every time I am blessed by Our Lord through my meetings with the inmates. During my four years of jail visits, I have shared with the inmates my love for the Book of Psalms, ways to study the Bible, the story of my conversion to Catholicism, and the spiritual basis of the 12 Step Program. Each visit (I conduct two every 6-8 weeks) renews my faith. To learn more about our ministry please contact Tony Galles (348-2301) or Jennifer Shama (381-1118).
