### --- Notes From Father Bill ---

Our diocese has a program called the **Ministry Formation Program**. The purpose of this program is to provide lay leadership for the parishes in the Diocese of Rapid City. This program includes the formation of commissioned lay ministers and permanent deacons. The diocese is hoping to begin new classes in the fall of 2013. **Lay Ministry Program** is a 4-year program consisting of spiritual, theological and pastoral formation. The program stresses formation as well as information, but emphasizes spiritual formation. The 3-volume text "Builders of the New Earth" provides methods of learning & insures that the members absorb the material and can use it in a way in which those to whom they minister can profit. The members are also asked to make three weekend retreats over four years. **Deacon Formation Program** is also a four-year program, but a man can apply for it after one year in the lay minister program. If married, both spouses must be part of the deacon program. In addition to the weekly classes in the lay ministry program, the deacon candidates and their wives are required to participate in eight formation weekends at the Sioux Spiritual Center and the annual Pastoral Ministry Days workshops. They are asked to have spiritual directors. We plan to start new classes in the fall of 2013. If interested, please contact me.

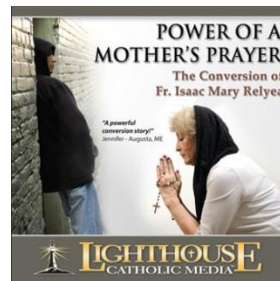

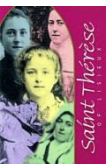
