An Update from the Hope For New Life (HFNL) Jail Ministry

A Message of Hope and Love Saint Paul writes in Romans, Our Lord "is sending us out around the world to tell all people everywhere the great things God has done for them, so that they too will believe and obey Him (Romans 1:5)". For those in our Diocese involved in the Hope For New Life (HFNL) Jail Ministry, Paul's charge to carry the Good News to "all people everywhere" includes the men and women in the Pennington County Jail. Each Wednesday members of the ministry visit the jail to share the Gospel and our experience, strength, and hope with the inmates. Between the hours of 6-9 PM we conduct four ministry groups: two for the male inmates and two for the female inmates. Each of these groups is facilitated by two ministry members. The inmates are very welcoming and open to our message of hope and redemption. In turn, we are richly blessed by our encounter with each of them. Our outreach includes the provision of individual Bibles and bringing the prayers of those separated from children, family and friends to our ministry prayer partners. These prayers are always heartfelt. One young woman's prayer reflects the fear and despondency we try to comfort: "I've been so overwhelmed after being here for three and a half months, my mind is just starting to spin. Prayer for the Jubilee of Mercy ~ Pope Francis

Lord Jesus Christ, you have taught us to be merciful like the heavenly Father, and have told us that whoever sees you sees Him.
