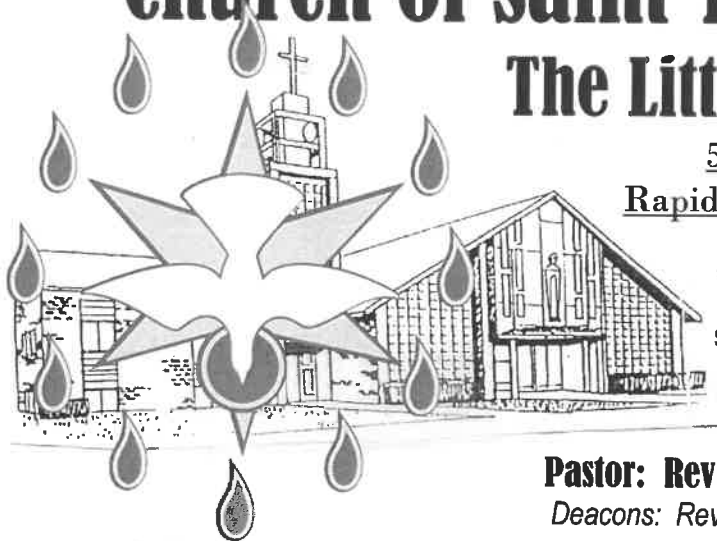

## **== Fr. Kerry's Korner ==**

Dear Friends,

**Pentecost is said to be experienced in power**, the sending of the Holy Spirit upon the Church; even called the birthday of the Church. How do we experience power? I want to share a story about St. Catherine of Sienna who lived during a time of division and schism in the Church. People were faced with the prospect of two popes, one residing in Avignon, France. St. Catherine was powerful in speaking to authority and urging a pope to resign for the good of Church unity. While this is a thumbnail sketch of the historical record, we do know that Catherine often made peace between warring city states and political leaders.

When she was a young child, she said she saw Jesus greet her on the street as she walked with an older brother. Jesus reached out, smiled, and blessed her. From that time on, she wanted to be a religious. Her parents deeply opposed the idea deciding that she must marry. They enforced long difficult chores, kept her from going to the church to pray, and distracted her as much as they could. She eventually learned that she could create "a secret chamber of my heart," where she could speak to Jesus and meet him there no matter what she was doing. Her parents finally conceded to allow her to pursue religious life, consecrating herself to God. Is the creation of the "secret chamber" power?

The power of the Holy Spirit is not always manifest in a showy way, tongues of flame or exuberant praise. The Spirit is also in stillness, silence, and adoration. St. Catherine said, "Be who God meant you to be and you will set the world on fire."

**Newman Centers throughout the state and the country** are helping our young people remain in the Church through their transition years of college while away from home. We have two Newman Centers in our Diocese at Black Hills State University, and the School of Mines and Technology. The parishes of St. Joseph in Spearfish and the Cathedral single-handedly serve these communities and are doing a wonderful job. But these young people come from our parishes and others, while our young people attend university in other places.

The Presbyteral Council, made up of a large contingent of our pastors in the diocese, feel there is an inequity that we should address. We think all the parishes of the diocese should have a chance to support the work of our Newman Centers serving students helping them grow in faith. **These two brave parishes can use our help!** Next week we will host a special collection for the Newman Centers of the Diocese of Rapid City. I hope you can be generous. When I was pastor of St. Joseph's, Spearfish, we began the Newman Club. It won many awards among the student organizations in those days. We have vocations coming from those Centers and many happy catholic marriages and leaders emerge from these two communities. The Holy Spirit is really blessing their work.

**Year of St. Joseph Indulgences**

*Granted by the Holy See from December 8, 2020 to December 8, 2021*

*Below is a summary of how you can receive the special indulgences granted by the Holy See for the Year of St. Joseph*

*A Plenary indulgence is granted under the customary conditions (sacramental confession, Eucharistic communion and prayer according to the intentions of the Holy Father) to the faithful who, with a soul detached from any sin, shall participate in the Year of Saint Joseph in any of the following ways:*

- ✚Meditate for 30 minutes on the Our Father
- ✚Participate on a 1-day retreat with a meditation on St. Joseph
- ✚Perform corporal and/or spiritual works of mercy
- ✚Recite the Holy Rosary as a couple or with family members
- ✚Pray the Litany of St. Joseph
- ✚Recite any approved prayer in honor of St. Joseph, especially on the days dedicated to St. Joseph: March 19, May 1, the 19<sup>th</sup> of every month, and on any Wednesday.
- ✚Entrust their work daily to the protection of St. Joseph
- ✚Invoke, with their prayers, the intercession of St. Joseph

The gift of the plenary indulgence extends particularly to:

- ✚The elderly
- ✚The sick
- ✚The dying
- ✚All those who for legitimate reasons cannot leave their home-who, with the spirit detached from any sin and with the intention of fulfilling, as soon as possible, the 3 usual conditions, **pray an act of piety in honor St. Joseph, confidently offering God the pains & difficulties of their lives.**

**Definition of indulgences:** A plenary indulgence means that by the merits of Jesus Christ, The Blessed Virgin Mary, and all the saints, the full remission of the temporal punishment due to sacramentally forgiven sins is obtained. The person becomes as if just baptized and would fly immediately to heaven if he died in that instant. A partial indulgence means that a portion of the temporal punishment due to forgiven sin is remitted. Indulgences can be applied to oneself or to a deceased loved one, but not to another living person.

**A Safe Environment For Children and Young People**

The Catholic Diocese of Rapid City is firmly committed to creating and maintaining the safest possible environment for our children and young people. To report allegations of sexual abuse by church personnel, contact the **Victim Assistance Coordinator**, Barbara Scherr. To ensure her independence in outreach to victims, she can be contacted at **605-209-3418 (cell)**. The phone has caller ID and messaging features. All information will be treated confidentially. Alleged victims are advised of their right to report alleged abuse to civil authorities.
