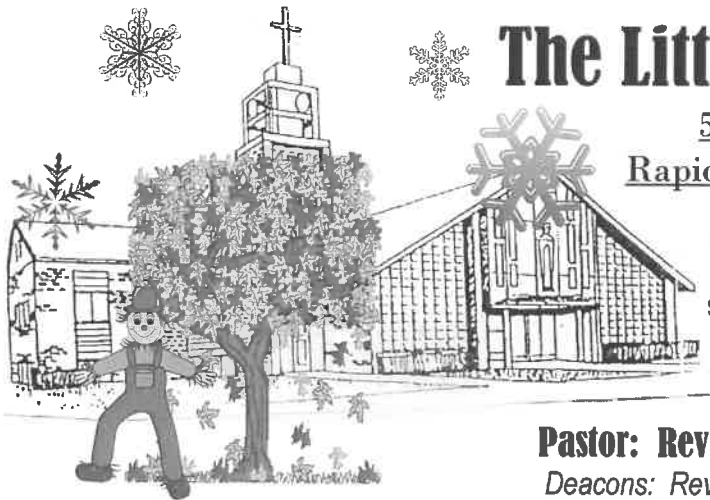

Faithful Citizenship *And one of them, realizing he had been healed, returned, glorifying God in a loud voice; and he fell at the feet of Jesus and thanked him.* Gratitude is a powerful motivator, and we owe our savior nothing less. In fact, the virtue of gratitude is not only due our creator and savior, but it is also an essential component of the human community, but it is tricky. There are three important conditions.

- ~ Gratitude can only exist between persons. As soon as the consciousness of the personal quality disappears and the idea of the apparatus (or government) prevails, gratitude dies.
- ~ Gratitude can exist only in the realm of freedom. As soon as there is a "must" or a claim, gratitude loses its meaning.
- ~ Gratitude can exist only with reverence. If there is no mutual respect, gratitude perishes. If the one who helps lets the other feel his superiority, then gratitude dies and in its place we find humiliation and resentment. How many persons who receive would like to throw the gift into the giver's face.

Dear Friends,

Last Tuesday, an acquaintance, a priest from the Diocese of Bismarck, Msgr. Austin Vetter, was named Bishop of Helena. We shouldn't read too much into this, but Helena waited 19 months for the appointment. I hope you are praying when you can for the new bishop to be appointed for us. Prayer cards for this purpose are at the entrances of the Church. We are the smallest diocese in the Lower 48 by number of Catholics. Men appointed here must see themselves in service of the Gospel in ways they haven't imagined for themselves.

I think becoming a bishop today means choosing to pick up an onerous cross, knowing, like Jesus, that it will involve persecution, misunderstanding, hardship; all the while giving opportunity for teaching, healing, growth and victory in the Gospel. They must have manifold gifts including administration. They should have learned a deep trust in God's love for them and in the Holy Spirit. I believe that we have always been sent the right man at the right time. I hope that our prayers for our new bishop has an additional grace of readying us to receive him and give him our support.

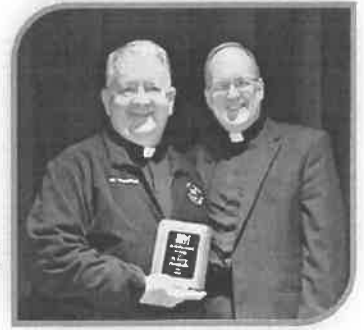

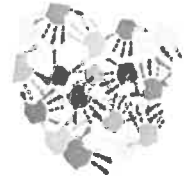

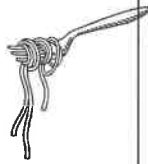

Penitential Act – Over the last two weeks we have
 considered the meaning of the Penitential Act. We tell Jesus
 that we are sinners and unworthy to be here. We also hear
 Jesus telling us that God is merciful. We can pray this
 prayer in three different ways. The most obvious way we
 express our sinfulness is in the Confiteor. The second form
 which is used less frequently acknowledges our sinfulness
 in two simple phrases. In these two forms, we proclaim
 God's mercy in Jesus with the Lord Have Mercy. The third
 form is a series of three statement that speak about God
 desire to free us from our sins. In this form we implicitly
 acknowledge our sin. The Lord Have Mercy is our response
 to the gracious love of God. All three forms can be used in
 the Mass.

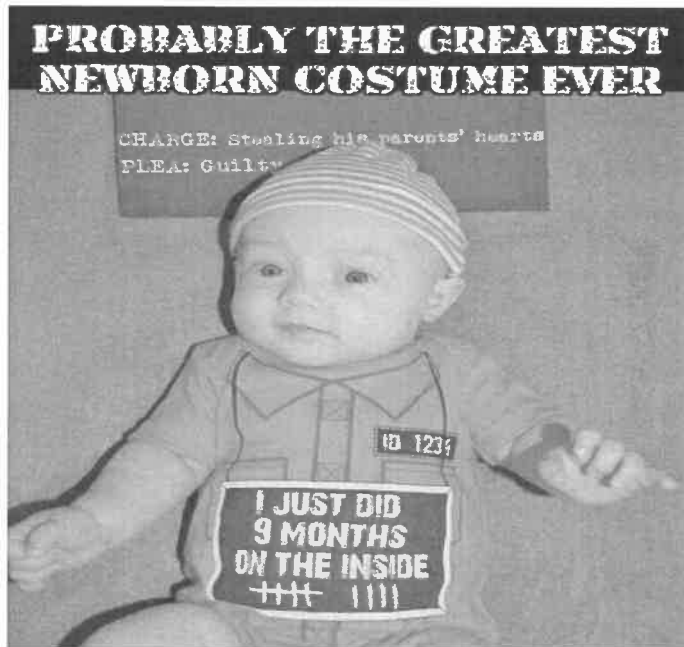
