== Fr. Kerry's Korner ==

Shortly after arriving as your pastor, I noticed that parking was at a premium in our parking lot and in the neighborhood. We have lots of parking for the handicapped, and lots of demand. In early August I learned that it was possible to buy a home adjacent to our parking lot to expand. Consulting with the Finance Council, we arrived at a consensus to go ahead with the purchase. When we presented the issue to the Parish Pastoral Council, they advised that we should attempt to purchase both houses, 828 Dilger and 832 Dilger, so that we would have the whole block. I immediately looked into the possibility and discovered that it was, in fact, for sale.

Last week we put in an offer that was accepted for the second home. The purchase of the near home was facilitated by a generous donation from the homeowner, a parishioner. We were able to get both properties for \$196,200. This will be paid by money we have in savings. In the near future we will begin to raise money for the remainder of the project, design, demolition, and paving. The process for this project is similar for the purchase project. We bring a plan to the Finance Council, communicate it to the Parish Pastoral Council, and if accepted we submit the plan to the Diocesan Building Committee, then the Bishop and College of Consultors for approval.

I would ask you to call me with any questions you may have. We will have a public meeting sometime in the near future to present the project and begin fund raising. In the meantime, if you wish to donate you can make a note on your check, Paving the Way for the Future, or parking lot.

Because of your stewardship of your financial gifts and the thrifty leadership of your former pastors and the Finance and Pastoral Councils, we were able to secure these properties in a timely way. It has been a long time since our land-locked parish has been able to expand. I am grateful and inspired by your generosity.
