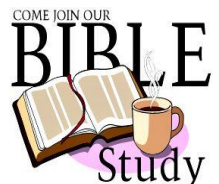

== Fr. Kerry's Korner ==

I am writing a brief reflection while on retreat at Terra Sancta because so many are holding the priests of the diocese in their prayers, and we are grateful. When I get up in the morning, I only need to seek out four sessions a day for prayer. Some are a half hour, others a holy hour. I meet with a spiritual director once a day and receive his attention and feedback about my prayer or things that have arisen in prayer. I am also doing a nightly vigil in the early morning hours. I walk and I nap at other times. I am on Holy Ground, Terra Sancta.

Time alone in silence is helping me find the Lord I overlook in busier times. With more time alone, I am finding his presence in past events, both struggles and joys, and being grateful that the Lord is with me. I am in Him.

Even more beautiful, I have been doing a spiritual inventory that has reminded me where I am seeing the Lord at work. It has led me, of course, to admit that he is most readily known in what I have seen and heard at St. Therese, the Little Flower church. I came across this quote of Therese's when she also realized she was meeting God in the ordinariness of her day: "I have not the courage to force myself to seek beautiful prayers in books; not knowing which to choose I act as children do who cannot read; I say quite simply to the good God what I want to tell Him, and He always understands me."

I echo the words of Jesus in these days, "I give you praise oh God, lord of heaven and earth, for what you have hidden from the wise and the learned, you have revealed to the child-like." Mt. 11.25
