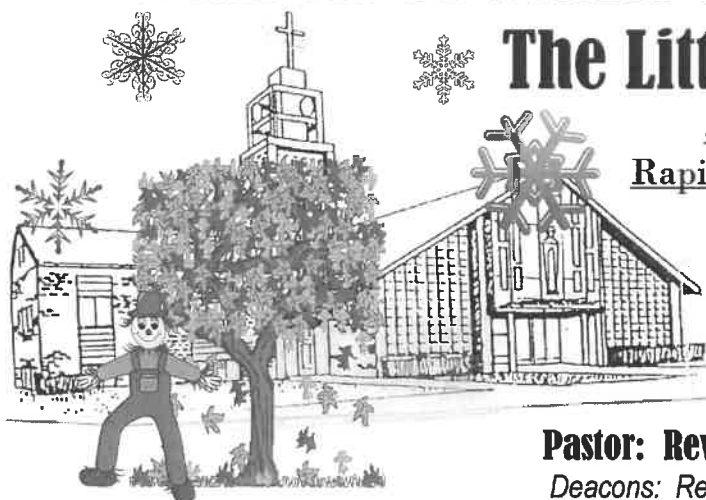

== Fr. Kerry's Korner ==

Dear Friends,

This past week the Church celebrated the Feast of St. Luke the Evangelist. The epistle that day from the second letter of Paul to Timothy, St. Paul, in prison and otherwise having a really bad year, writes, "But the Lord stood by me and gave me strength, so that through me the proclamation might be completed and all the Gentiles might hear it. 2 Timothy 4.17" These words from his prison confinement are a reminder that in all things and in every way God is with us. A trusted aid had abandoned him after his imprisonment, his defense in Rome was hampered by the lack of people stepping up to his defense, and even basic comfort items, his cloak and papers, had been left behind. Paul had the grace and the experience to know that nothing could separate him from the love of God.

We are increasingly feeling the burden of standing for Christ in a world become hostile to all our Lord stands for and teaches. The Catholic Church is the lightning rod for opposition in our defense of human life in the womb. We represent a remnant of Christianity that teaches the full and sacred vision of God's creation in the dignity of human sexuality and gender, that our Lord truly has a vision for his children to follow for happiness and holiness. Add to these challenges the effects of the priest abuse crisis, and the diminution in the eyes of many of the Church's moral authority. We are not imprisoned by the lack of unity in the Christian witness, nor are we bound in chains by the acts (and inaction) of Church leadership. Rather, with Paul we can assert that "there is nothing that can separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus, Romans 8.38-39."

Luke shared similar challenges with fewer resources when he recalled these words of Jesus, "The harvest is abundant, but the laborers are few; so ask the master of the harvest to send out laborers for his harvest. Go on your way; behold, I am sending you like lambs among wolves. Lk. 10.2-3" I believe that any one of us who steps out in courage to speak will be given the words someone needs to hear. I am certain that grace will flow to anyone who comes to the defense of the defenseless. And when the Lord comes He will find faith on the earth.

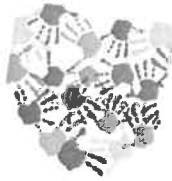

Hope For New Life (HFNL) Ministry

Stewardship Opportunity The Diocesan annual call to Stewardship creates a unique spiritual opportunity to discover God's mission for your life. How will you respond to the Stewardship Initiative challenge: "to know Jesus and to share Jesus with one another...[through] generous hospitality, lively faith, and dedicated discipleship." Our HFNL Jail Ministry, which has been active since July 2006, presents one opportunity for Stewardship. We serve a group of our community's most marginalized members: the 600 plus inmates of the Pennington County Jail. Most of the inmates who attend our sessions are in their 20's and 30's. These are not hardened criminals. Many are victims of dysfunctional families and life styles, abuse, and low self-esteem. Pope Francis has challenged Christians "to work for reconciliation by going out of our way to meet someone having a difficult time, someone who has not been treated as a person, as a worthy son or daughter of this land." Who better fits the Pope's appeal for Christian outreach than one of our locally imprisoned brothers or sisters in Christ? Please prayerfully consider joining our HFNL Jail Ministry.

We also seek volunteers for our HFNL prayer partner team. Serving as a prayer partner is a safe, private, and holy way to participate in jail ministry. You would receive and pray upon individual inmate prayer requests as your time permits. Our annual HFNL Jail Christmas Caroling Program is scheduled for Wednesday December 18, 2019. It seeks to create and facilitate a sacred, "hands-on" space for children called an atrium, in which both the children and their catechists can hear, ponder and celebrate the most essential mysteries of the Catholic faith as revealed in the Scriptures and the liturgy. Originally developed in Rome by Sofia Cavalletti and Gianna Gobbi fifty years ago, the Catechesis continues to spread worldwide. This course will ground the participant in the theory and praxis of CGS while also concretely preparing him/her to develop and facilitate an atrium for 3-6 year old children.
