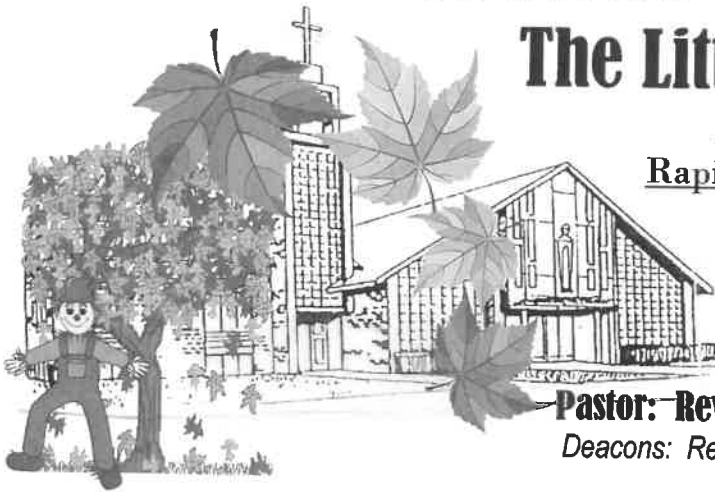

Faithful Citizenship "[Religious] freedom remains one of America's most precious possessions. And, as my brothers, the United States Bishops, have reminded us, all are called to be vigilant, precisely as good citizens, to preserve and defend that freedom from everything that would threaten or compromise it." - Pope Francis

Since 2009 in Nigeria, Boko Haram has destroyed over 200 churches, displaced nearly two million people, killed at least 20,000 people, created over 200,000 refugees, and kidnapped hundreds, including many women whom it has made sex slaves. While Boko Haram has attacked and killed both Muslims and Christians, Christians are disproportionately represented among these many victims, and, of course, explicitly targeted. In 2013, it is estimated, more Christians were killed as a result of persecution in Northern Nigeria than in the rest of the world combined.

== Fr. Kerry's Korner ==

Dear Friends,

Shortly before I graduated from high school in 1976, Pope, now Saint Paul VI, said in a document on evangelization, "Modern man listens more willingly to witnesses than to teachers, and if he does listen to teachers, it is because they are witnesses." At the time, I was thinking about being a veterinarian, or a teacher of English as a second language, traveling the world. I was also thinking about being a priest. The 70's were a confusing time for more than 17 year-olds, and I was surely ready to hear a witness.

While I was driving to a retreat prior to entering the seminary, I heard on the car radio that Pope Paul VI had died. Much of the world saw a tired and sickly man grown weak under the burden of bringing the church through the upheaval and renewal of The Second Vatican Council. Today we look back and see the holy prophet who courageously called the family of the Church to holiness and prophetic witness that was living in what John Paul II would later call the culture of death. Pope Paul VI told us, "If you want peace, work for justice."

I have never been short of witnesses since I learned to see them around me. Pope Francis recently canonized with Paul VI an Archbishop of El Salvador, Oscar Romero who was martyred while saying mass. He encouraged all people to see their prophetic role for bringing about peace and justice, "Each one of you has to be God's microphone. Each one of you has to be a messenger, a prophet. The church will always exist as long as there is someone who has been baptized...Where is your baptism? You are baptized in your professions, in the fields of workers, in the market. Wherever there is someone who has been baptized, that is where the church is. There is a prophet there. Let us not hide the talent that God gave us on the day of our baptism and let us truly live the beauty and responsibility of being a prophetic people."

Jesus said to his apostles that they would share his prophetic life and death, "The cup that I drink, you will drink, and with the baptism with which I am baptized, you will be baptized." The Lord tells us that many in our Church will suffer for what is right and their suffering will encourage many. They will be outstanding witnesses and provide hope. Let us rejoice in the Lord, in our baptism and live in the freedom we have with a prophetic voice that calls for freedom and justice for everyone still suffering. St. Oscar Romero said during the most distressing time of his persecution, "Let us not forget: we are a pilgrim church, subject to misunderstanding, to persecution, but a Church that walks serene, because it bears the force of love."
