

Against Despair To be isolated and cut off from family and loved ones is surely the most difficult and trying condition anyone can face. Feelings of isolation and despair are very real to the inmates of Pennington County Jail. Consider this recent prayer from a male inmate during our Wednesday group: Dear Heavenly Father, I pray for my wife and I pray for my kids... that [we] will be together again. Lord, please help me with my troubles and my sorrows. I shed tears for [my family] every day. Fix my life. Teach me your ways, Father. Amen. But it is precisely in such a seemingly hopeless situation that Our Lord can reach out through His Holy Spirit, providing salvation, love and hope to those who would otherwise despair. Jesus assures us of the gift of the Holy Spirit, the Advocate and Spirit of Truth: "He lives with you and will be in you. I will not leave you as orphans; I will come to you....Because I live, you also will live...you are in me and I am in you (John 14: 17-20)." HFNL was established 11 years ago for the express purpose of bringing Our Lord's Good News to our imprisoned brothers and sisters. During each of our weekly jail visits, our message to the men and women is always one of Hope: The Lord will guide us in our deepest struggles, forgive our sins, hear our prayers, and shoulder the burdens we cannot bear.
