

As we draw near to the end of Year of Mercy, it is most appropriate to reflect on the ways in which Our Blessed Mother embodies Mercy to her children. How often do we pray . . . Hail Holy Queen, Mother of Mercy, Our life, our sweetness, and our hope ...

For centuries, Christians all over the world have cried out to the Blessed Virgin Mary with these words, placing themselves under her tender care as "Mother of Mercy."
