Faithful Citizenship Red Cloud Indian School was founded by members of the Society of Jesus—the Jesuits—from the Wisconsin Province. The Jesuits were originally founded in 1540 by Saint Ignatius Loyola. Loyola wished that all Jesuits act in imitation of Christ at all times. They quickly became well known as educators and scholars, and for ministering to the poor, the sick, and the imprisoned. Their work extended across the globe, in places like Asia, Africa, and India. The Jesuits gained fame for several of their challenging ideas. Foremost, it followed the law of Cura Personalis, or care for the person, in all of its endeavors. This meant that even poor people, foreigners, and Indigenous people were to be treated with the dignity due to any child of God. www.redcloudschool.org

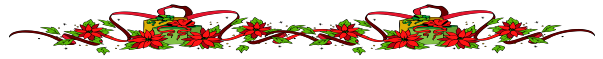

Thursday the Church celebrates all the saints: canonized or beatified, and the multitude of those who are in heaven enjoying the beatific vision that are only known to God. During the early centuries the Saints venerated by the Church were all martyrs. Later, the Popes set November 1 as the day for commemorating all the Saints.

The Solemnity, a holy day of obligation, reminds us of what the Fathers of Vatican Council II called the universal call to holiness. They said, "we must follow in His footsteps and conform [our]selves to His image seeking the will of the Father in all things. [We] must devote [our]selves with all [our] being to the glory of God and the service of [our] neighbor. In this way, the holiness of the People of God will grow into an abundant harvest of good, as is admirably shown by the life of so many saints in Church history" (Lumen Gentium, 40).

Please look at the mass schedule for Wednesday and Thursday. On that day you may want to relate to others the patron saint you chose for Confirmation. We are surrounded by this great cloud of witnesses.

This year marks our 11th endeavor to bring the joy and blessings of the Christmas holiday to the inmates. Our program includes the singing of carols with guitar and flute accompaniment and the distribution of over 600 bags of holiday candies and Holy cards to the inmates we entertain. Because our regular weekly jail groups average about 45-50 men and women (6-7 percent of the jail population of 650 people), the Christmas Program gives us a wonderful opportunity to reach out to many more inmates in several different cell blocks. This year's Christmas Program will take place on Wednesday December 20. To make this a truly enjoyable event for the inmates, we ask you to consider donations of puzzles (especially those with a Christian theme), Christmas cards, and paperback books (themes: action, Westerns, historical). Donation boxes are available at the HFNL Display Shelves in the Cathedral, Blessed Sacrament, and St. Therese. We remind you that inmate prayer requests are collected in binders which are also available for your reflection at our Display Shelves.
