Faithful Citizenship HISTORY OF THE NATIONAL PRAYER

VIGIL FOR LIFE "The National Rosary for Life and all-night vigil at the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception began in 1979 from the inspiration of Maryknoll Brother Goretti Zilli from New York. Fifty people attended the first vigil Mass celebrated by Fr. John Gabin of Philadelphia in the lower level Crypt Church. Eucharistic adoration and other devotions continued through the night, with Fr. John Randall of Providence offering Mass at midnight. Brother Michael Cerrone, (who later became Army Chaplain Fr. Michael Cerrone) coordinated and led prayers through the night for an end to abortion, and then led the group in the March for Life the following morning."
