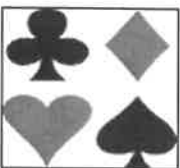
The month of the October is dedicated to Our Lady of the Most Holy Rosary. Her Memorial Mass is on October 7 in the Universal Church calendar. Our tradition of praying the rosary before Mass and ending it in time for each person to make their own proximate preparation for mass in prayer, beautifully lives this gift of Marian prayer in our community. It encourages us to devotion and instructs our hearts in the gospel at a level our human awareness doesn't always appreciate. The rosary fosters a relationship with Mary whose sole purpose is to reveal her Son, Jesus. If we truly trust in Mary, then we will always be ready to go to Jesus.

"In dangers, in doubts, in difficulties, think of Mary, call upon Mary," notes Saint Bernard of Clairvaux. "While invoking her, you shall never lose heart; so long as she is in your mind, you are safe from deception; while she holds your hand, you cannot fall; under her protection you have nothing to fear; if she walks before you, you shall not grow weary; if she shows you favor, you shall reach the goal." That goal, of course, is her Son, Jesus Christ.

Archbishop Fulton Sheen has always seen in the rosary a way of accessing and deeply entering the mystery of Christ in our life. He says, "The rosary is the book of the blind, where souls see and there enact the greatest drama of love the world has ever known; it is the book of the simple, which initiates them into mysteries and knowledge more satisfying than the education of other men; it is the book of the aged, whose eyes close upon the shadow of this world, and open on the substance of the next. The power of the rosary is beyond description."

In preparation for the month of the rosary, I found an app for my phone where I can pray the rosary along with others. There are many such available. I like to pray it when I drive or take walks. Is there something you might do to make the rosary a part of your day this year?

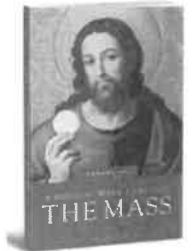
