Faithful Citizenship HISTORY OF THE NATIONAL PRAYER VIGIL FOR LIFE

"The National Rosary for Life and all-night vigil at the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception began in 1979 from the inspiration of Maryknoll Brother Goretti Zilli from New York. Fifty people attended the first vigil Mass celebrated by Fr. John Gabin of Philadelphia in the lower level Crypt Church. Eucharistic adoration and other devotions continued through the night, with Fr. John Randall of Providence offering Mass at midnight. Brother Michael Cerrone, (who later became Army Chaplain Fr. Michael Cerrone) coordinated and led prayers through the night for an end to abortion, and then led the group in the March for Life the following morning."

Do you, or do you know a spouse, family member, or friend who is open to the possibility of becoming Catholic? Are you an adult that was baptized in a Catholic church but never received the Sacraments of Confirmation and/or Eucharist?

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) will begin in late August for those who are considering joining the Catholic Church. An Update from the Hope For New Life (HFNL) Jail Ministry
Becoming a Prayer Partner for HFNL Ministry

Does the thought of stepping inside a room filled with inmates send you miles past your comfort zone—and yet, your heart cries softly to find some way to relate to these strangers? Perhaps to help them find a way to experience Christ's mercy? Perhaps to answer His call to come to the aid of the least of our brothers, even to the prisoner? We have created a loving, yet safe way for you to provide hope to someone who seeks safety for a family member, for strength to overcome addiction, for a change in lifestyle, for the courage to know and follow Jesus. Each prayer partner receives an email each week listing the prayers of the men and women we visit each Wednesday evening at the Pennington County Jail. Your email address is never released to the jail or to anyone outside of this prayer group. Your response is up to you: a personal prayer for each inmate, a rosary for their intentions, or time spent in Adoration on their behalf. Whatever your response, the power of prayer is truly the power that makes our ministry work.
