== Fr. Kerry's Korner ==

Dear Friends,

One of the most enigmatic of Jesus' sayings in, "the man who seeks to save his life will lose it, and the man who loses his life for my sake will find it." We see the truth of it in lives all around us, but we don't always see it in ourselves while it is happening. Recently I heard the news of an African priest who was martyred for the faith and then burnt. His young priesthood was cut short by hatred of the faith, but his life offering will bring him eternal life. Martyrdom which is more frequent today than it was in the early church, is only one way to lose our life for the Lord. Another way is love.

St. Therese, the Little Flower said, "To love is to give everything and to give oneself." While she desired to be a missionary, she confined herself to a monastery in Normandy, France dedicated to prayer. She kept in contact with missionaries by letter to encourage them with her prayers. In her brief 24 years she gave her all. Her gifts, even the writings which inspire the world are simple. The ways we will be called to give everything and to give ourselves will also be simple. I follow a new mother on Facebook who is journaling about the wonder, the late nights, the first cold, and the myriad adjustments she makes to care for the new life she and her husband have been given. I can see clearly how this is a losing of life that ends in Christ and makes his love known.

Each of us are inspired in different ways: some by articulate words, always by courageous deeds, some by clear teaching. The Holy Spirit give gifts to all in abundance. As we look around us and see God at work in the lives of others, remember, we too are being observed, sometimes be the youngest and most impressionable eyes.

Year of the EUCHARIST

DIOCESE OF RAPID CITY | JUNE 2019 - JUNE 2020

The Entrance Chant – Beginning this weekend as we walk through the Year of the Eucharist, we will focus on different aspects of the Mass. We will be stopping at specific times in the Mass to explain the action we are engaging and how this moment in the Mass leads us into an encounter with Jesus.

The Introductory Rites of the Mass are meant to do two things. First, they draw us together as a community, as the Body of Christ at prayer. Secondly, they help focus our minds and hearts to listen to God's Word in this encounter and to celebrate the Mass worthily.

So, before we sing the entrance chant or opening song, we want to understand that this song is part of our prayer. It is a prayer set to a melody. Singing this prayer helps to open us to the celebration we are entering. St. Augustine said, "When you sing, you pray twice." This opening song is not to get the priest and ministers from the back to the front of the church but is meant help prepare our hearts and minds for this great prayer, the Eucharist, which we are about to celebrate. As in any deep encounter, our heart and mind must be actively engaged. This moment is both the beginning of our prayer to the Father and the beginning of this beautiful encounter. How we participate in this part impacts what happens in our hearts as we lift them to the Lord in praise and worship.

But Should We? The Ethics of Artificial Reproductive Technologies

Just because we can, doesn't mean we should. Join us for an evening to explore ethical questions surrounding reproductive technology such as surrogacy, IVF and sperm donation with renowned film director and ethicist, Jennifer Lahl, President of the Center for Bioethics and Culture Network. Lahl couples her 25 years of experience as a pediatric critical care nurse and a hospital administrator, with a deep passion to speak for those who have no voice. As a field expert, she is routinely interviewed on radio and television including ABC, CBS, PBS, and NPR. She wrote and directed the documentary film Eggsploration, and Anonymous Father's Day, a documentary film exploring the stories of women and men who were created by anonymous sperm donation.
