



## It's the Annual TRUNK OR TREAT OCTOBER 24th at 6:45 PM



## == Fr. Kerry's Korner ==

Brothers and sisters:

I know how to live in humble circumstances;
I know also how to live with abundance.
In every circumstance and in all things
I have learned the secret of being well fed
and of going hungry,
of living in abundance and of being in need.
I can do all things in him who strengthens me.
Still, it was kind of you to share in my distress.

Phil. 4.12-14

These most quotable words of St. Paul to the Philippians give the measure of the apostle to the Gentiles, a man of strength and purpose, undeterred by hardship. They also very quietly highlight an essential element of the early Church, "it was kind of you to share in my distress." Paul is somewhat softly referring to a collection they sent him to aid in his work and support him during imprisonment. There are other times when the Acts of the Apostles mention Paul getting together a collection to help the struggling Church in Jerusalem under persecution.

The Church has always had a concern for the worldwide mission of bringing the Gospel to all the nations. We have always sent missionaries, priests, sisters, and laity to mission lands to share what we have received, life in Christ. The missions in Africa and Asia are doing so well currently, that they are sending priests and religious back to Europe and the Americas to help the current lack of vocations. We can literally say to them, "it was kind of you to share in my distress."

This month we will take up two important national collections sponsored by the United States Bishops: World Mission Sunday and Peters Pence. Peters Pence is rescheduled from last Holy Week when we did not have Mass. Mission Sunday is our once a year collection to aid the Mission effort of the Catholic Church worldwide. I hope you will share the preparation of your gift with your children so that, as a family you may examine every circumstance of your relative abundance and your need. Perhaps you will, with St. Paul, help them see that you "can do all things in him who strengthens me."
